AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Port Control to employ one or more consultants, developers, or vendors needed for various projects, services, and upgrades to implement and facilitate an Airport Sustainability Management Plan and other related projects; and to enter into various written standard purchase and requirement contracts needed in connection with the Plan.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to employ by contract or contracts one or more consultants, developers, or vendors or one or more firms of consultants, developers, or vendors for the purpose of supplementing the regularly employed staff of the several departments of the City of Cleveland in order to provide professional services necessary to implement and facilitate an Airport Sustainability Management Plan and other related projects (the "Plan").

The selection of the consultants, developers, or vendors for the services shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Port Control from a list of qualified consultants, developers, or vendors available for employment as may be determined after a full and complete canvass by the Director of Port Control for the purpose of compiling a list. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control. The contract or contracts authorized shall be prepared by the Director of Law, approved by the Director of Port Control, and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 2. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to make one or more written standard purchase contracts and written requirement contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, the period of requirements to be determined by the director, for the necessary items of materials, equipment, supplies, and services necessary for the Plan, including labor and materials if necessary, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies on a unit basis for the Department of Port Control. Bids shall be taken in a manner that permits

an award to be made for all items as a single contract, or by separate contract for each or

any combination of the items as the Board of Control determines.

That the costs of the requirement contract or contracts shall be Section 3.

charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall

certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be

made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies by a delivery order

issued against the contract or contracts and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 4. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases and/or

services authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements

with other governmental agencies. The Director of Port Control may sign all documents

that are necessary to make the purchases and/or obtain such services, and may enter

into one or more contracts with the vendors and/or consultants selected through that

cooperative process.

Section 5. That the cost of the contract or contracts authorized under this

ordinance shall not exceed \$500,000 and shall be paid from Fund No. 60 SF 001 (RQS

3001, RLA 2023-123)

That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, Section 6. provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to

Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period

allowed by law.
