AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Approving the collective bargaining agreement with the International Local 100, AFSCME Ohio Council 8 AFL-CIO; and to amend Section 8 of Ordinance No. 194-2021, passed March 29, 2021, as amended, relating to salaries for various classifications.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That under division (B) of Section 4117.10 of the Revised Code, this Council approves the collective bargaining agreement with the International Local 100, AFSCME Ohio Council 8 AFL-CIO, under the terms contained in **File No. 1143-2023-A**, for the period from April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2025, and which provides, among other things, for an increase in the salaries and wages for the majority of members of the bargaining unit under the following schedule:

2%	April 1, 2022
2%	April 1, 2023
2%	April 1, 2024

The remaining members of the bargaining unit will be compensated in accordance with the terms contained in the File.

Section 2. That Section 8 of Ordinance No. 194-2021, passed March 29, 2021, as amended by Ordinance No. 1073-2021, passed November 29, 2021, Ordinance No. 94-2022, passed March 21, 2022, Ordinance No. 697-2023, passed June 5, 2023, and Ordinance No. 901-2023, passed August 16, 2023, is amended to read as follows:

<u>Section 8</u>. <u>International Local 100</u>, <u>AFSCME Ohio Council 8 AFL-CIO</u>. That salaries in the following classifications shall be fixed by the appointing authority in accordance with the schedule appearing after each classification:
