

Ordinance No. 1226-2022

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

To supplement Ordinance No. 838-2021, passed October 11, 2021, by adding new Section 5a relating to authorizing a contract with Teledyne API for the purchase of three proprietary air monitors needed for the 2022-2023 Ohio Environmental Protection Agency Division of Air Quality operational grant.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 838-2021, passed October 11, 2021, is supplemented by adding new Section 5a to read as follows:

Section 5a. That this Council determines that the within commodities and services are non-competitive and cannot be secured from any source other than Teledyne API. Therefore, the Director of Public Health is authorized to make one or more written contracts with Teledyne API on the basis of its proposal dated November 11, 2022, for the purchase of three proprietary air quality monitors and associated equipment and software in the amount of \$115,827, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies, for the Division of Air Quality, Department of Public Health.

Section 2. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
