

Ordinance No.1425-2019

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the FY19 Port Security Grant Program; and authorizing the purchase of one fire boat, including associated equipment, and shipping or delivery.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to apply for and accept a grant in the approximate amount of \$900,000, and any other funds that may become available during the grant term from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to conduct the FY19 Port Security Grant Program; that the Director is authorized to file all papers and execute all documents necessary to receive the funds under the grant; and that the funds are appropriated for the purposes described in this ordinance.

Section 2. That the grant is approved in all respects, including the obligation of the City of Cleveland to provide cash matching funds in the amount of \$300,000 from Fund No. 11 SF 006. (RQS 6003, RL 2019-112)

Section 3. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to extend the term of the grant during the grant term.

Section 4. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to make one or more written contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for each or all of the following items: one (1) fire boat, including associated equipment, and shipping or delivery, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies for a gross price, for the Division of Fire, Department of Public Safety.

Section 5. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Public Safety may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

Section 6. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by

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the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
