

# Ordinance No. 152-2021

## AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Utilities to enter into one or more contracts with the Cleveland Water Alliance for professional services necessary to provide state-of-the-art water quality detection equipment, deploy, maintain, and retrieve data from four buoys in Lake Erie, for the Division of Water, Department of Public Utilities, for a period of three years with an option for the City to purchase all or a portion of the monitoring equipment any time after the first year of the contract.

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WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Utilities is authorized to enter into one or more contracts with the Cleveland Water Alliance for professional services necessary to provide state-of-the-art water quality detection equipment, deploy, maintain, and retrieve data from four buoys in Lake Erie, for a period of three years. The contract shall contain a provision allowing the City of Cleveland to purchase all or a portion of the monitoring equipment any time after the first year of the three-year period. The contract or contracts shall not exceed \$195,560 annually. The costs of the first year of the contract shall be payable from Fund No. 52 SF 001. The remaining two years of the contract are subject to annual appropriation. (RQS 2002, RLA 2021-17).

Section 2. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
