**SUBJECT:** Ordinance No. 1247-2019 Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to Apply for and Accept a grant from U.S. Department of Justice for the FY19 Federal Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant – Local Solicitation and to enter into one or more contracts to implement the grant

---

Ordinance No. 1247-2019 would authorize the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice for the FY19 Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). If approved by Council, the legislation will provide funding for personnel for the Division of Police. The legislation authorizes one or more contracts with Cuyahoga County and the cities of Euclid, Garfield Heights, Parma and East Cleveland for the implementation of the grant.

**Purpose of Grant:**

The goal of the Justice Assistance Grant is to provide funding for equipment, services and personnel to advance basic law enforcement efforts. The City of Cleveland was selected by the grant recipients, Cuyahoga County and the cities of Euclid, Garfield Heights, Parma and East Cleveland to be the fiscal agent on behalf of the cities and the County. The funding will be divided as follows:

<b>City of Cleveland:</b>	\$445,345
<b>Cuyahoga County:</b>	111,540
<b>Garfield Hts:</b>	10,002
<b>Euclid:</b>	25,613
<b>Parma:</b>	10,515
<b>East Cleveland:</b>	<u>11,316</u>
<b>TOTAL:</b>	<u>\$602,791</u>

The funding provided to the City of Cleveland will be used to maintain personnel.
