AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Designating East 79th Street between Chester Avenue and Hough Avenue with a secondary and honorary designation of "Glenn T. Settle Way".

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of public peace, property, health or safety in that the citizens of Cleveland want to honor Glenn T. Settle with a second and honorary street designation on East 79th Street; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

<u>Section 1.</u> That East 79th Street between Chester Avenue and Hough Avenue is designated with a secondary and honorary designation of "Glenn T. Settle Way".

<u>Section 2</u>. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
