LEGISLATIVE DESCRIPTION:

Authorizing the Directors of Public Works, Parks and Recreation and Finance to employ one or more temporary employment agencies to provide professional services to supply temporary and seasonal personnel for the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Project Clean program and for various departments of the City, for a period up to one year.

LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE:

Passage of this legislation will allow General and any other Fund allocations to the Department of Parks and Recreation to clean and cut vacant lots, vacant structures, parks and cemeteries.

Passage of this legislation will allow CDBG Fund allocation to the Department of Parks and Recreation to hire seasonal workers to clean and cut City-owned land bank properties.
