

Resolution No. 997-2019

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION

Declaring the intent to vacate a portion of Keene Court S.W. and West 31st Street.

Council members Santana, Johnson, Brancatelli
(by departmental request)

WHEREAS, this Council is satisfied that there is good cause to vacate a portion of Keene Court S.W and West 31st Street as described; and

WHEREAS, this resolution constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That this Council declares its intent to vacate a portion of the following described real property:

Keene Court S.W.

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio and known as being a portion Keene Court S.W. (16 feet wide))(formerly known as an un-named alley) in the Barber and Lord Subdivision, of part of Original Brooklyn Township Lot No's. 51 and 52, as shown in Volume 11 of Maps, Page 26 of Cuyahoga County Records, further described as follows:

All that remaining portion of Keene Court S.W. (16 feet wide)(formerly known as an un-named alley) extending easterly from the east right of way line of West 32nd Street (66.00 feet wide))(formerly known as Penn Street) to the portion of Keene Court S.W. vacated by City of Cleveland ordinance 1622-98 passed September 14, 1998.

West 31st Street

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio and known as being a portion of West 31st Street (16 feet wide)(formerly known as an un-named alley) in the Barber and Lord Subdivision, of part of Original Brooklyn Township Lot No's. 51 and 52, as shown in Volume 11 of Maps, Page 26 of Cuyahoga County Records, further described as follows:

All that portion of West 31st Street (16 feet wide) extending southerly from the south right of way line of Keene Court (16.00 feet wide)(formerly known as an un-named alley) to the north right of way line of Chatham Avenue (66.00 feet wide))(formerly known as Chatham Street).

Legal Description approved by Greg Esber, Section Chief, Plats, Surveys and House Numbering Section.

Section 2. That this resolution is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
