Ordinance No. 1486-2025

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE To vacate a portion of East 71st Place.

By Council Members Starr, Bishop, Hairston and Griffin (by departmental request)

WHEREAS, under Resolution No. 299-2025, adopted March 31, 2025, this Council declared its intention to vacate a portion of East 71st Place; and

WHEREAS, a notice of the adoption of the above vacation was served on the abutting property owners affected by the resolution, which stated a time and place when objections would be heard before the Board of Revision of Assessments; and

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2025, the Board of Revision of Assessments approved the above vacation under the provisions of Section 176 of the Charter of the City of Cleveland; and

WHEREAS, this Council is satisfied that there is good cause for vacating a portion of the above and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and that it should be made; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

<u>Section 1.</u> That this Council declares that the following described real property is vacated:

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio and known as being all that portion of East 71st Place (30.00 feet wide) extending from the south right of way of Grand Avenue (60.00 feet wide) to the north right of way of State Route 10 (AKA Opportunity Corridor Boulevard, Width Varies).

Legal Description approved by Eric B. Westfall, P.S., Section Chief, Plats, Surveys and House Numbering Section.

<u>Section 2.</u> That provided all required approvals have been obtained, the Commissioner of Engineering and Construction is directed to record the vacation plat in the office of the Recorder of Cuyahoga County.

<u>Section 3.</u> That the Clerk of Council is directed to transmit a copy of this ordinance to the Auditor of Cuyahoga County.

Section 4. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
