

Request for Legislation

An amendment to Ordinance No. 544-17, passed June 5, 2017, giving authority to the Department of Public Utilities to enter into one or more requirement contracts for the Purchase of Labor and Material necessary for the removal, transport and dispose of Transformers, by including testing and disposal of PCB oils and contaminated materials, and to test and retrofill or filter contaminated transformers.

Background/Purpose:

An Ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Utilities to enter into one or more requirement contracts for the purchase of labor and materials necessary to transport and dispose of transformers. The Division of Cleveland Public Power has various substations where transformers are located which are old, worn, and unsafe. There are also distribution transformers that have failed and have been removed from service. This equipment must be removed and disposed of in an environmentally safe manner.

Scope of Work:

The scope of work will include, all labor, materials, equipment, necessary to remove and transport transformers to EPA approved disposal site.

Justification/Urgency:

These contracts are required to removal any contaminated equipment, and to disposal of the equipment in a safe and environmentally friendly manner.

Anticipated Costs and funding source:

General Operating Funding and other sources of funding approved by the Finance Director will be used for this contract. The estimated amount is \$100,000.00.

Schedule or Term of Contract:

Legislation is to lead to a requirement contract or contracts for the period of two (2) years and two (2) one (1) year options to renew, the first of which will require additional legislative approval.
