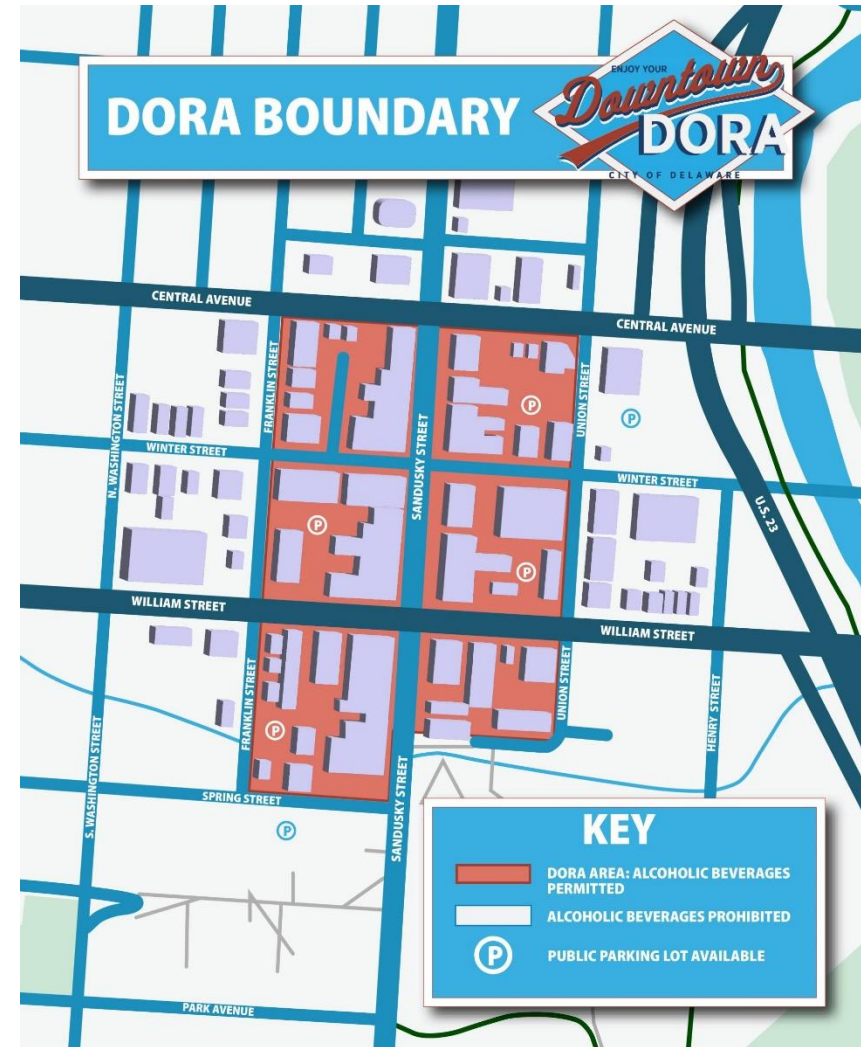

DORA BASICS

What is a DORA?

- **Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area**
 - Ohio Revised Code 4301.82(B)(4)
 - Allows for the creation of a specific area which is exempt from certain open container provisions
 - Grants the local authority the power to:
 - Create
 - Size
 - How many
 - Hours of operation
 - What cups are used
 - Health, Safety and Sanitation plans
 - Currently 58 counties have at least one DORA




DORA BASICS


What is a DORA?

- **Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area**

- Cities with a population over 50,000 may have up to 6 DORAs
- Combined up to 640 contiguous acres
- Minimum of 4 required qualified permit holders
- DORAs may be expanded or discontinued







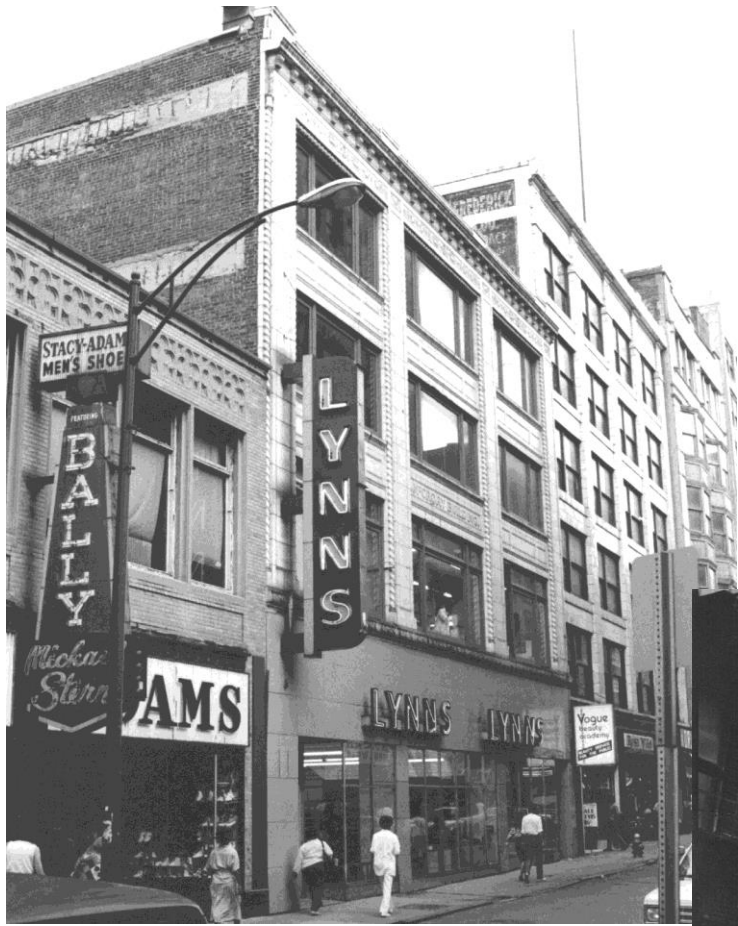

RULES

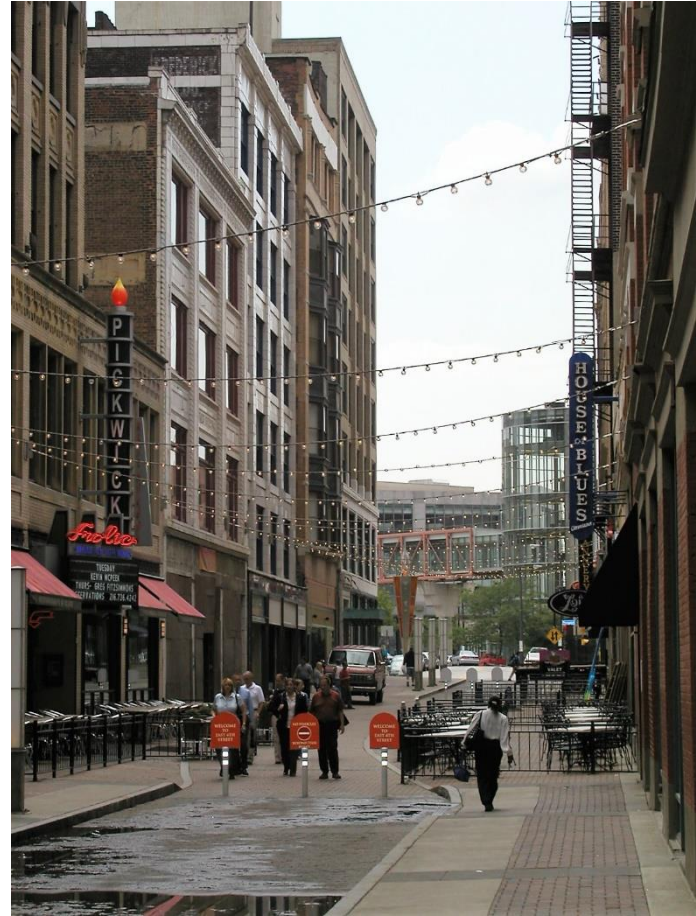
- No cups can be taken beyond the district boundaries. Please refer to this district map.

- Cups from one liquor licensed establishment cannot be taken into another liquor licensed establishment.





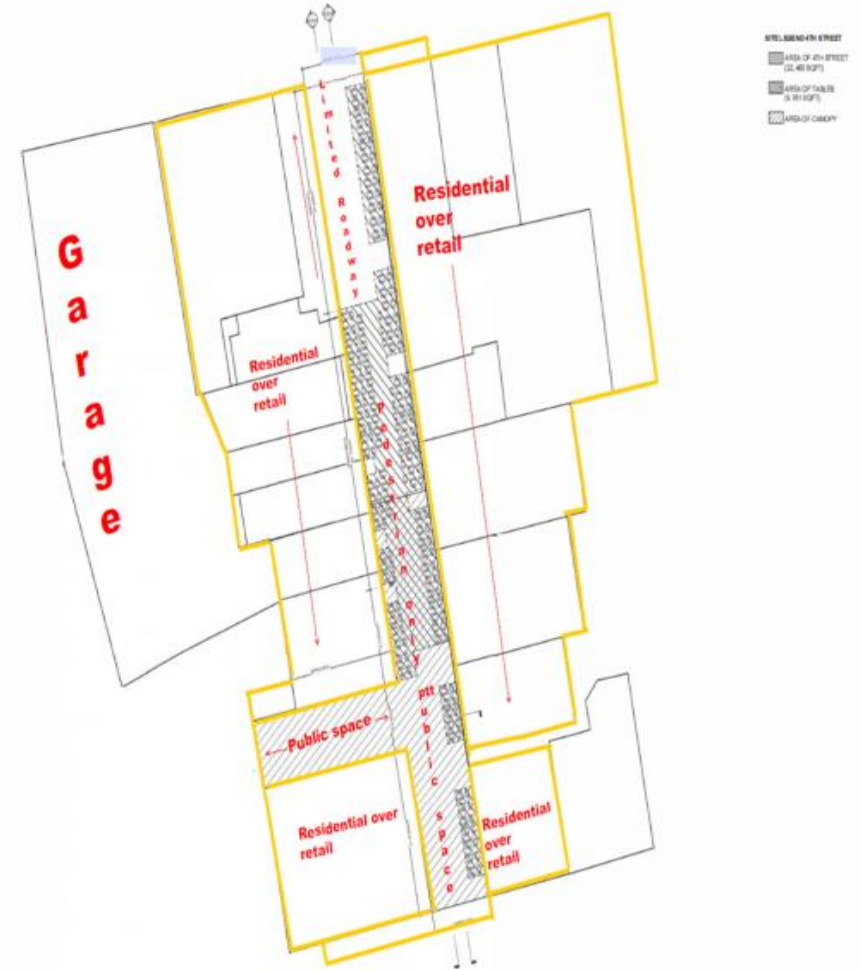


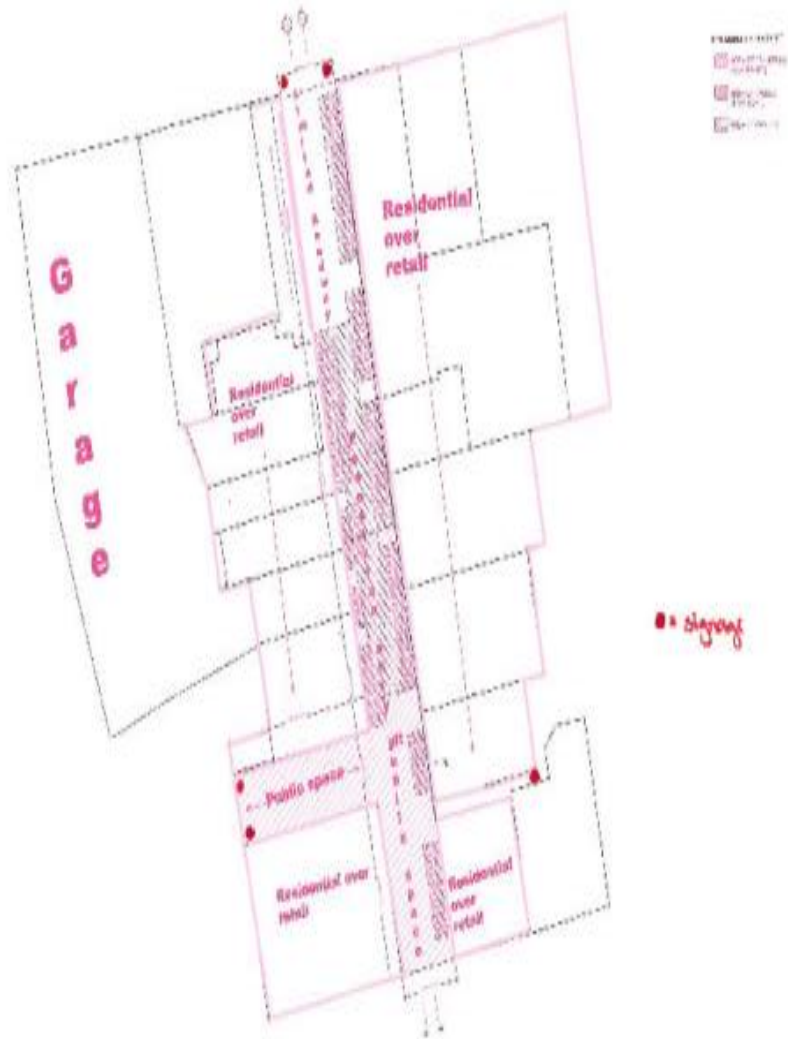




E. 4th Street Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area

- Application accepted per the Ohio Revised Code 4301.82(B)(4) and Cleveland Codified Ordinance 699B.02(b)(4)
- Hours of operation will be Monday through Sunday, 12:00 PM to 2:00 AM
- The Public Safety Plan includes an MOU with Downtown Cleveland Alliance in developing and implementing a comprehensive Neighborhood Security and Safety Plan with Clean & Safe Ambassadors and Fire/EMS
- The Sanitation Plan includes adding six (6) trash cans and DCA will continue providing services
- Signage, official DORA cup
