#### AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Health to accept a grant from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency for financial assistance for the operation of the Division of Air Quality; authorizing the director to enter into one or more contracts for various services, equipment and supplies, and contracts with various agencies or entities necessary to operate the Division of Air Quality; determining the method of constructing, rehabilitating, renovating, replacing, or otherwise improving air monitoring sites and other similar structures on city-owned and city-leased property; and authorizing the director to enter into one or more contracts to construct the improvement and to design it.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Health is authorized to accept a grant in the approximate amount of \$2,630,253, and any other funds that become available during the grant term, from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency for financial assistance for the operation of the Division of Air Quality in accordance with the purposes set forth in the summary; that the Director of Public Health is authorized to file all papers and execute all documents necessary to receive the funds under the grant; and that the funds are appropriated for the purposes in the executive summary for the grant.

Section 2. That the executive summary for the grant, **File No. 549-2023-A**, made a part of this ordinance as if fully rewritten, is approved in all respects and shall not be changed without additional legislative authority, including the obligation of the City of Cleveland to provide cash matching funds in the sum of \$276,100, payable from funds appropriated in 2023 and 2024 for this purpose, and to provide in-kind benefits in the amount of \$116,900, in order to receive the grant from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, as a pass-through from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, is approved in all respects, and shall not be changed without additional legislative authority. (RQS 5007, RLA 2023-49)

Section 3. That the Director of Public Health is authorized to make one or more written requirement contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of

Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for the requirements for the grant period of the necessary items of materials, equipment, services, and supplies needed as described in the file, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies upon a unit basis for the Division of Air Quality, Department of Public Health. Bids shall be taken in a manner that permits an award to be made for all items as a single contract, or by separate contract for each or any combination of the items as the Board of Control determines. Alternate bids for a period less than the grant term may be taken if deemed desirable by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies until provision is made for the requirements for the entire term.

Section 4. That the costs of the contract or contracts shall be charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies by a delivery order issued against the contract or contracts and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 5. That the Director of Public Health is authorized to make one or more written contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for each or all of the following items during the term of the grant: various types of monitoring equipment, OEPA-required equipment and their associated parts, and other materials, equipment, supplies, and services needed to implement the grant, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies on a unit basis, for the Division of Air Quality, Department of Public Health.

Section 6. That, under Section 167 of the Charter of the City of Cleveland, this Council determines to make the public improvement of constructing, rehabilitating, renovating, replacing, or otherwise improving air monitoring sites and other similar structures on City-owned and City-leased property (the "Improvement"), for the Division of Air Quality, Department of Public Health, by one or more contracts duly let

to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders after competitive bidding on a unit basis for the Improvement.

Section 7. That the Director of Public Health is authorized to enter into one or more contracts for the making of the Improvement with the lowest responsible bidder or bidders after competitive bidding on a unit basis for the Improvement, provided, however, that each separate trade and each distinct component part of the Improvement may be treated as a separate improvement, and each, or any combination, of the trades or components may be the subject of a separate contract on a unit basis.

Section 8. That the Director of Public Health is authorized to employ by contract or contracts one or more consultants or one or more firms of consultants for the purpose of supplementing the regularly employed staff of the several departments of the City of Cleveland in order to provide professional services necessary to implement the grant as described in the file.

The selection of the consultants for the services shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Public Health from a list of qualified consultants available for employment as may be determined after a full and complete canvass by the Director of Public Health for the purpose of compiling a list. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control. The contract or contracts authorized shall be prepared by the Director of Law, approved by the Director of Public Health, and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 9. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized by this ordinance may be made through cooperative agreements with other governmental agencies. The Director of Public Health may sign all documents that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

That the Director of Public Health is authorized to enter into one or Section 10.

more contracts with and make payments to one or more various entities or agencies to

implement the grant as described in the file.

That the Director of Public Health shall have the authority to extend Section 11.

the term of the grant during the grant term.

That the Director of Public Health shall deposit the grant accepted Section 12.

under this ordinance into a fund or funds designated by the Director of Finance to

implement the program as described in the file and appropriated for that purpose.

That the payments and cost of the contracts authorized in this Section 13.

ordinance shall be paid from the fund or funds which are credited the grant proceeds

accepted under this ordinance and from the cash match.

That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to

Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period

allowed by law.
