National Youth Sports Program (NYSP) at Case Western Reserve University

ORDINANCE NO: 614-2026

DESCRIPTION: Authorizing the Director of Parks and Recreation to enter into one or more agreements with the National Youth Sports Program at Case Western Reserve University for the operation of a youth development summer program in the year of 2026.

LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE: The Director of Parks and Recreation shall have legislative authority to enter into one or more contracts with the National Youth Sports Program at Case Western Reserve University to provide a youth summer sports, nutrition, health, and life skills development program for 2025 under the National Youth Sports Program supported by Case Western Reserve University.

The NYSP is an instructional program that uses sports participation and competition as a vehicle to promote active, healthy lifestyles; enhance self-esteem; promote respect for oneself and others; and reinforce the importance of education to one's future.

This program combines nutrition and health services with sports activities, life skills development, and education. Offered over a five-week period, participants receive 64 hours of physical activity, including 11.5 hours of fitness and 28 hours of educational programming. The program also includes a medical examination for participants and breakfast and lunch.

Field trips are included in this program and locations may include Cleveland Museum of Art, Allen Medical Museum, Natural History Museum, Western Reserve Historical Society, Cleveland Botanical Gardens, and Case Western Reserve facilities (Law School, School of Medicine, F.P. Bolton School of Nursing, Adelbert Hall administrative offices, Office of Multicultural Affairs, and Squire Valleevue Farm.
