Executive Summary

Background/Purpose: This legislation authorizes the Director of the Cleveland Department of Public Health to apply for and accept a federal grant from the Department of Homeland Security as a direct grantee for financial assistance for the operation of the Division of Air Quality.

To perform air pollution control activities throughout Cleveland and Cuyahoga County as delegated by the Department of Homeland Security and to comply with all its contractual obligations. These activities fall within the Field Monitoring Section.

Field Monitoring Section: The Cleveland Department of Public Health, Division of Air Quality (DAQ) Monitoring section currently operates fifteen (15) BioWatch sampling sites in Cuyahoga and Lake counties (the Cleveland jurisdiction) utilizing Portable Sampling Units (PSU). Cleveland DAQ collects exposed filters and replenishes the collectors with new filters daily. The exposed filters are delivered via courier to the designated Laboratory Response Network laboratory.

This ordinance would allow the Director of the Cleveland Department of Public Health, on behalf of the Division of Air Quality to enter into all contracts and all amendments with the Department of Homeland Security and to:

1. Perform the air pollution control monitoring activities throughout Cleveland and Cuyahoga County as a direct grantee to the Department of Homeland Security and fulfill all contractual obligations stated in the contract agreement.

Emergency Preparedness Section: will support and assist in the coordination and execution of all CDPH emergency preparedness operations, to include BioWatch plan development and planning related to the resulting consequences of a positive BAR (BioWatch Actionable Result). Will assist in the collaboration and coordination of CDPH public health emergency preparedness initiatives with of other City of Cleveland departments, regional, state, and federal partners. Will serve as a public health first responder during an event/incident requiring public health monitoring or response.

Instrument Tech – \$7,011.00; 1 Position; time devoted to Bio Watch efforts during the 12 month program period.

Environmental Monitoring Specialist 1 – \$44,550.00; 5 Positions; time devoted to Bio Watch efforts during the 12 month program period.

Environmental Monitoring Specialist 3 – \$36,584.00; 2 Positions; time devoted to Bio Watch efforts during the 12 month program period.

Emergency Preparedness Program Specialist - \$17,688.00; 1 position; time devoted to Bio Watch efforts during the 12 month program period.
