Goals for Expenditure of Contract Services **Funding**

- Provide high-quality programming for Out-of-School time in our Neighborhood Resource and Recreation Centers (NRRCs) and other community spaces
- Provide employment opportunities for youth ages 14-18 and stipend-based community service opportunities for youth ages 10-14

Youth Employment

- Summer employment and academy opportunities provided by YOU
 - Lifeguard Training (34 participants, 28 certified, 21 hired)
 - Marketing Academy (10 participants received certification in coding and marketing)
- o City and County Extended Summer
 - High school graduates with no employment or post-secondary plans
- Two stipend-based community service programs during summer
- Cleveland Freedom Project



Employment Highlight: Making Our Own Space





- 15 youth participated at Michael Zone NRRC to earn a total of \$4,131.80 (avg of \$275.45 per youth) over the 3 week period
- 16 youth participated at Alexander Hamilton to earn a total of \$3,554.90 (avg of \$222.18 per youth) over the 3 week period


