Under-speed Vehicles: Overview

- Proposing
 - Golf cart-related business opportunities
 - Concierge, taxi, ride share, limo, tours, supporting business operations
 - Only applies to legitimate businesses (golf carts not available for individuals to rent)
- Background
 - Approached by prospective businesses to authorize use of under-speed vehicles on Cleveland streets
 - Authorization aims to promote accessibility and enrich business opportunity
 - Allow for people to travel longer distances to meet their needs
 - Increase available modes of transportation
 - Greater access to leisurely activities
 - Based upon equivalent legislation in Columbus, Put-In-Bay, and Muskingum County



How Did This Proposal Come Together? Business Interest

Golf Cart Concierge: Chris Taylor

- Offers tours, shuttles, and convenience services
- Fills short-distance travel gaps near entertainment venues and sporting events
- Supports visitor accessibility
- Enhances business activity, particularly Downtown and the Flats

Cleveland Tours: Bob Polk

- Tours of Downtown, Ohio City, and Tremont
- Expands upon Bob's Bike Tour business in the same neighborhoods
 - Public Square → Ohio City → Gordon Square → Little Italy → Edgewater Community →
 Downtown Cleveland

Operationalizing State and Safety Requirements

- State law says that local authorities (city) may authorize the operation of under-speed vehicles on roadways under its jurisdiction.
- State law requires that we include the following in our local law:
 - Vehicles limited to streets with speed limits of 35 miles per hour or less
 - Vehicles must pass an inspection by the Cleveland Division of Police (inspection standards set by state law)
 and be registered and titled with the State
- To ensure operations are safe, Public Safety given broad discretion to promulgate safety rules or terminate authorization, should it be required.



Legislation Components

- 1. Allowing operation and licensing of under-speed vehicles for businesses
- 2. Licensing requirements for businesses
 - Valid driver's license
 - Proof of ownership
 - Proof of gross vehicle weight
 - Payment of inspection fee
 - Certificate of Good Standing
- 3. Rules and Regulations by Director of Public Safety
 - For vehicles, businesses, and drivers
- 4. Annual inspections by the Cleveland Division of Police
- 5. Operation regulations
 - Required equipment
 - Information to display
- 6. Suspension, revocation, and appeals
- 7. Penalties
