

# Ordinance No. 1286-2023

(by departmental request)**

## AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Community Development to enter into one or more grant agreements with various entities to assist with a lead safe program using a portion of City's Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, as authorized under Ordinance No. 119-2022, passed May 23, 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 995-2022, passed October 24, 2022.

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WHEREAS, under Ordinance No. 119-2022, passed May 23, 2022, this Council directed a portion of the City's Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund payment to the extent of the City's reduction in revenue resulting from the COVID-19 public health emergency by authorizing the Director of Community development to enter into one or more subrecipient agreements with The Mt. Sinai Health Care Foundation to assist with a lead safe program; and

WHEREAS, under Ordinance No. 119-2022 agreements were authorized for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 119-2022 was amended by Ordinance No. 995-2022, passed October 24, 2022, to, among other things, require additional legislation if any contract, loan, or grant authorized under Section 2(a) using the funding provided in Section 3 Ordinance No. 119-2022, was over \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:**

Section 1. That the Director of Community Development is authorized to enter into one or more contracts with the following entities to assist with a lead safe program using a portion of the City's Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund, as under Ordinance No. 119-2022, passed May 23, 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 995-2022, passed October 24, 2022:

Section 2. That the contracts and other appropriate documents needed to complete the transactions authorized by this legislation shall be prepared by the Director of Law.

Section 3. That the aggregate costs of the contracts shall not exceed \$900,000 and shall be paid from the Fund Payment identified in Section 3 of Ordinance No. 119-2022 and from other funds approved by the Director of Finance. (RQS 8006, RL 2022-03)

Section 4. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
