

THERE IS NO LEGAL OBJECTION TO THIS LEGISLATION IF AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. In Section 4, line 3, after "251.09" insert "251.091", after "251.23" insert "251.231, 251.232", and after "251.34" insert "251.341".

2. In Section 4, after "Section 251.09" insert new Section 251.091 to read as follows:

Section 251.091 Air Quality and Health Impact Report

"Air Quality and Health Impact Report" means a report produced by the City Division of Air Quality that identifies population vulnerabilities, environmental burdens, and disparate health conditions specific to City census blocks.

3. In Section 4, after "Section 251.23" insert new Sections 251.231 and 251.232 to read as follows:

Section 251.231 Cumulative Impact Assessment

"Cumulative Impact Assessment" means the process used to evaluate how a new or modified source is likely to exacerbate existing health conditions relative to the cumulative impact of all pollutant and non-pollutant sources in a specified area, and to all other variables included in the definition of "Cumulative Impact" in this Chapter.

Section 251.232 Disproportionate Impact

"Disproportionate Impact" means the disproportionately adverse health, environmental, climate-related and other negative cumulative impacts on disadvantaged communities, including people of color, low-income people, and Indigenous populations.

4. In Section 4, after "Section 251.34" insert new Section 251.341 to read as follows:

Section 251.341 Health Impact Assessment

"Health Impact Assessment," or "HIA," means an evaluation tool used by a facility to address the positive and negative public health effects from a new or modified source. The HIA includes a defined community engagement plan that addresses health data, including but not limited to, public health concerns, health data of the population affected, and environmental data.

5. In Section 257.01, at division (e)(1), line 7, strike "evaluated and updated as needed" and insert "updated at minimum".
