

# Ordinance No. 1249-2019

## AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Utilities to enter into one or more requirement contracts without competitive bidding with Northcoast Process Controls, Inc. for the inspection and repair, including but not limited to labor and materials, of existing valve actuator systems and appurtenances manufactured by Rotork Manufacturing Company, for the Division of Water, Department of Public Utilities, for a term of two years.

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WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That this Council determines that the within commodities are non-competitive and cannot be secured from any source other than Northcoast Process Controls, Inc. Therefore, the Director of Public Utilities is authorized to make one or more written requirement contracts with Northcoast Process Controls, Inc., on the basis of their proposal dated October 1, 2019, of the requirements for a term of two years for the inspection and repair, including but not limited to labor and materials, of existing valve actuator systems and appurtenances manufactured by Rotork Manufacturing Company, to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies on a unit basis, for the Division of Water, Department of Public Utilities.

Section 2. That the costs of the contract or contracts shall be charged against the proper appropriation accounts and the Director of Finance shall certify the amount of any purchase under the contract, each of which purchases shall be made on order of the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies by a delivery order issued against the contract or contracts and certified by the Director of Finance. Section 3. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
