### Ord. No. 354-2026

By Council Member Griffin (by departmental request)

An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Finance, on behalf of the Mayor's Office of Prevention, Intervention and Opportunity, to enter into one or more contracts with After-School All-Stars for the purpose of providing after-school youth enrichment activities under the City's Out of School Time Program, for a period of one year, with two one-year options to renew, exercisable by the Director of Finance.

Estimated Cost: \$240,167
