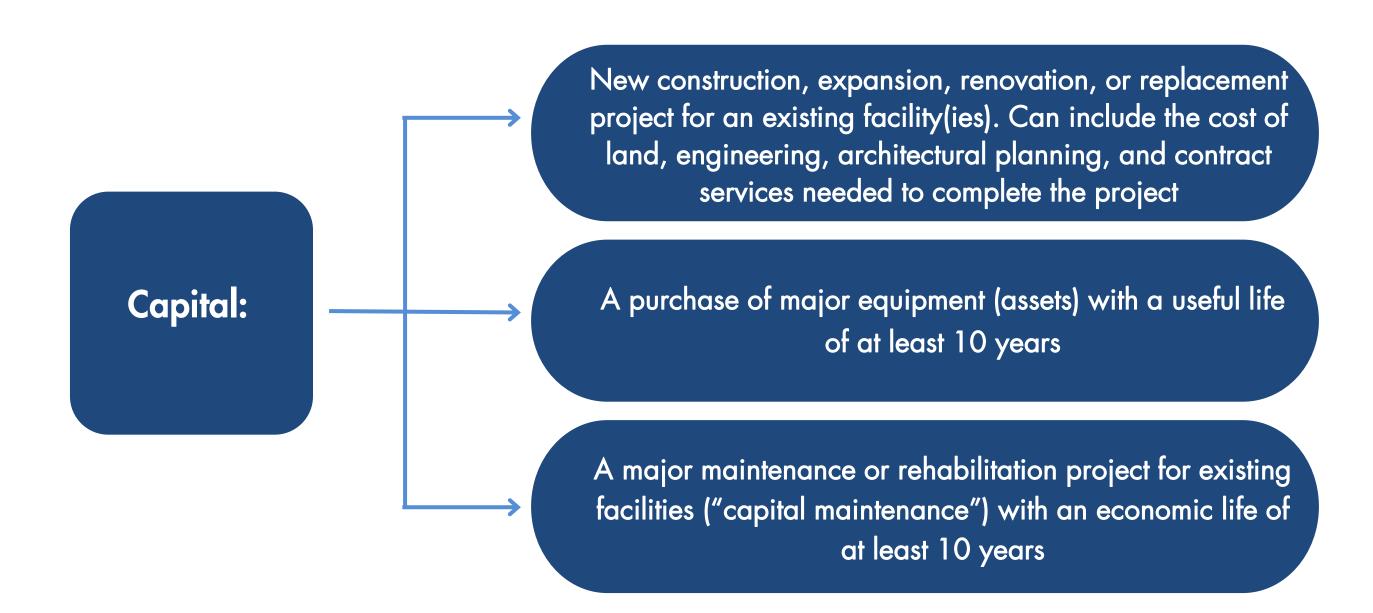


# **From Chief Teeuwen**

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The Capital Improvement Plan is essential to the operations of the City of Cleveland and its residents. The plan prioritizes long-term capital projects and commits funds to ensure the City's public facilities, infrastructure, and equipment are sustainable now and in the future.





# **Bond Types**





Funding is assigned to the repair and replacement of capital equipment or city owned facilities such as fire stations and salt domes. Primary users are Public Works and Public Safety



#### Recreation

Funding is assigned to the repair and replacement of park equipment, recreation centers, and sports courts including design and construction services. Primary user is Parks and Recreation



# **Road & Bridges**

Funding is assigned to the repair and replacement of roads, bridges and sidewalks including design and construction services. Primary user is MOCAP.



# **CIP Selection Process**

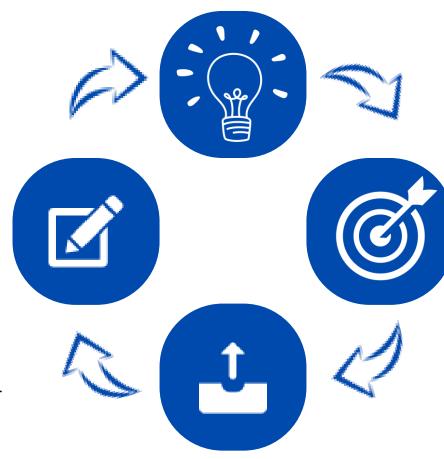


#### **CIP Revised**

The CIP is revised based on committee feedback and questions are directed to the departments for review, additional information or clarification. The process repeats until final.

#### **CIP Committee Review**

The committee reviews the first CIP draft and presents questions to MOCAP or provides additional guidance. Committee members include: Chief Teeuwen, Chief Epstein, Director O'Keefe, Director Mersmann, Director DeRosa.

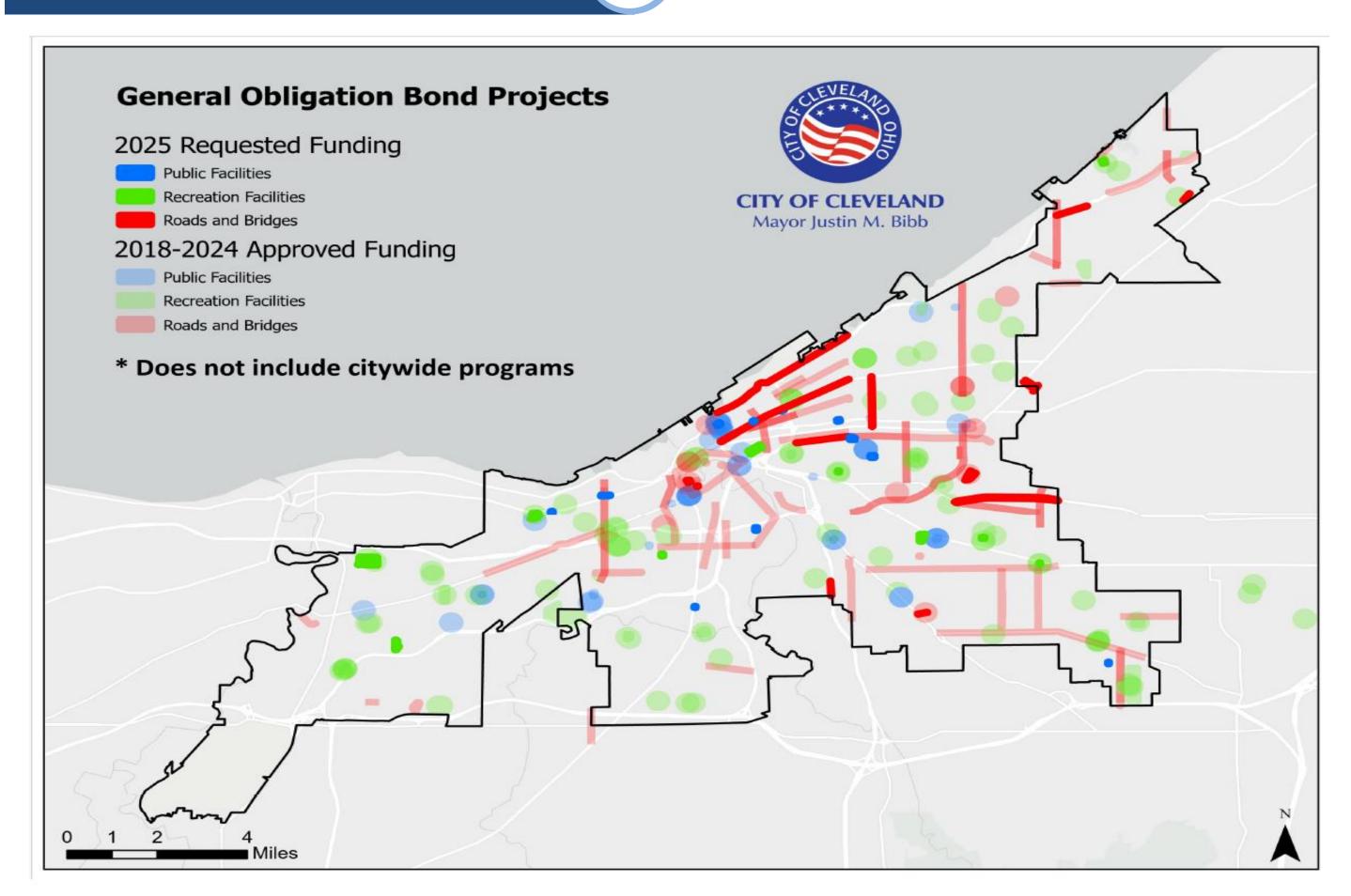


# **Department + Council Input**

Departments and council members are asked to list and prioritize their proposed capital projects on a shared spreadsheet or submitted through the Project Intake Form.

#### **Prioritization**

With over \$140M combined capital projects submitted by Departments, prioritization becomes critical in narrowing selections. The priorities are Safety, Physical Condition, Regulatory Compliance, Legal Compliance, Funding Commitments, and Mayoral and Council Priorities.



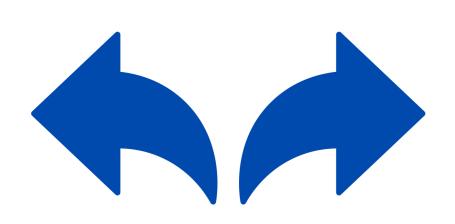

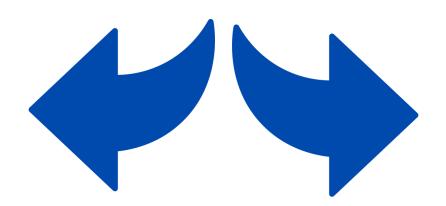

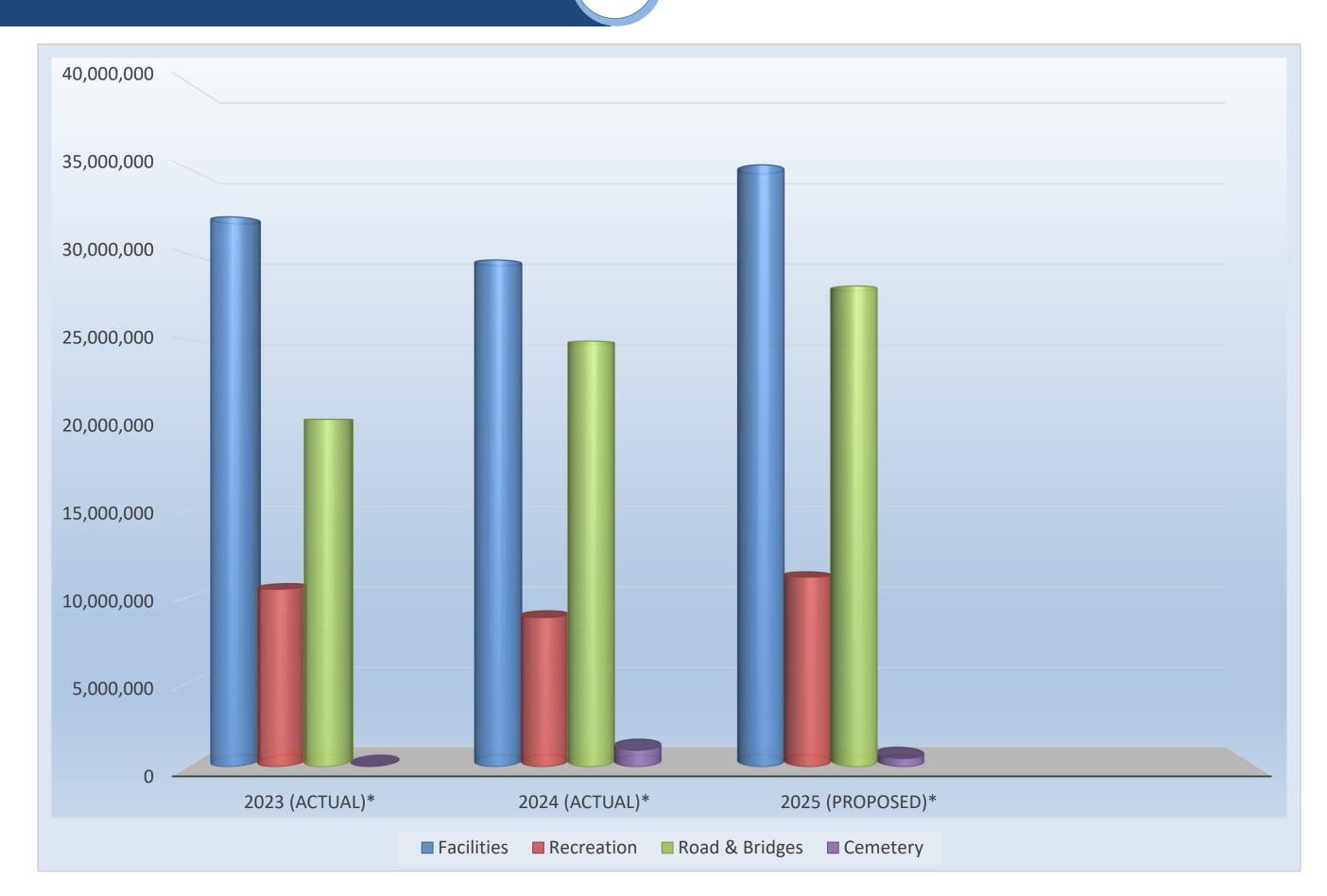

# **Bond Funding Highlights**





## **Recreation Glow Up**

Recreation initiative to provide basic updates and repairs including paint, lighting and flooring.



**\$8M For Roads** 

City Council request an additional \$8M for residential road resurfacing. Projects will be selected based on the current Pavement Condition Rating.



#### **Public Vehicles**

Division of Motor Vehicles provided a prioritized list of vehicles for all general fund departments. The total amount approved for funding is \$12M.
