

Ordinance No. 113-2026**By Council Member:** Jones

An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of the Department of Public Safety to enter into agreement with NuPoint Community Development Corporation for the Community Safety Workshops, providing residents with resources enhancing personal and public safety through the use of Ward 1 Casino Revenue Funds.

WHEREAS, providing community workshops addressing public safety by improving walkability, public engagement and visual impact in the City of Cleveland is a valid public purpose for municipal expenditures providing for the health, wellness, and general welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of the Department of Public Safety is hereby authorized to enter into agreement with NuPoint Community Development Corporation for the proper public purpose of providing community safety training workshops for youth, women, fire and home, men and block watch initiatives through necessary training, resources, and supplies to enhance personal and community safety through the use of Ward 1 Casino Revenue Funds.

Section 2. That the cost of said contract shall be in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00, and shall be paid from Fund No. 10 SF 188 using the fund and project number from the following Ward:

Section 3. Project shall begin as of September 1, 2025.

Section 4. That the Director of Law shall prepare and approve said contract and that the contract shall contain such terms and provisions as the Director deems necessary to protect the City's interest.

Section 5. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
