**DESCRIPTION:**

Authorizing the Director of Finance to enter into an agreement with Beat the Streets to provide Out of School Time programming for a fee not to exceed \$60,800 for a period of one year, with two one-year options to renew.

Beat the Streets Cleveland is a wrestling-based program that provides structured physical activity that promotes fitness, discipline, and healthy lifestyle habits. The curriculum also includes a social-emotional learning component that helps youth build coping skills, process grief and recover from adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) common in their communities. This dual focus on mind and body creates a foundation for sustained health and resilience. This program will be offered at 2 sites for four seasons. Programming is provided one day a week for two hours per day for youth ages 10 – 14. The maximum number of participants is 25 per site. The cost for this program for one year is \$60,800.

## **ACTIVITY SUMMARY:**

The Mayor's Office of Prevention, Intervention and Opportunity (MPIO) creates youth, young adult and family centered programs and initiatives, establishes key external partnerships and aligns city resources in an effort to address the social determinants of health. The overarching goals are to prevent violence before it occurs; reduce the adverse consequences of violence and trauma on youth, families and communities; improve community wellness and resiliency; and increase access to quality programming, resources and support services for all City of Cleveland residents.

The Out of School Time (OST) Programs provide a variety of programming and activities in our NRRCs and other community spaces. These programs and activities for youth and adults were aligned to four categories for 2026:

1. Prenatal – Early Childhood
2. Educational Outcomes and Out of School time
3. College and Career Readiness
4. Overall Wellbeing

Mayor Justin Bibb has made violence prevention a priority every summer since taking office in 2022 and the Out of School Time Programs play a major role in focusing the attention of our youth on positive programs and activities where they can learn and explore, and responsible adults can provide mentorship and guidance.

The requested legislation will allow the Mayor's Office of Prevention, Intervention and Opportunity to continue offering expanded programs and activities that meet the needs of our community.
