**Executive Summary  
Title X Program**

**Background/Purpose:**

This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Health to apply for and accept a grant in the amount of \$ 417,000 per year and any other funds that may become available during the grant term, from the Ohio Department of Health to conduct the Title X Program; authorizing the director to charge and accept fees; entering into one or more agreements to receive payments from Medicare, Medicaid, Medicaid HMO programs and other third-party insurers; entering into one or more contracts with The MetroHealth System, a county hospital, organized under R.C. 339, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health, Lamar Advertising Company, Commuter advertising, E-Clinical Works (new EMR through the local collaborative), UpToDate company and other necessary services to implement the grant and authorizing one or more requirement contracts.

The Title X Program is designed to improve the overall health and well-being of women, men and children by improving health care access, promoting healthy lifestyles and encouraging the establishment of a reproductive life plan. This grant enables CDPH to provide contraceptive services, supplies and information to low income and underserved populations.

This funding enables CDPH to increase the number of hours of the Reproductive Health Clinic, as well as expand access to a broader range of acceptable and effective family planning methods and related preventative services such as preconception counseling, natural family planning methods enhanced patient education to adolescents, women of reproductive age and men. This grant year CDPH expanded lab services so that more comprehensive testing can be done within the reproductive health clinics.

CDPH conducts two evening Teen Wellness Clinics - Tuesdays at J Glen Smith and Thursdays at Blanket Mills from 4:00 pm - 8 pm and conduct a Saturday clinic the first Saturday of the month at Blanket Mills and the second Saturday at J. Glen Smith from 8:00 am - 12:00 pm to offer STD exams (including HIV), blood pressure, cholesterol, blood glucose screenings, and family planning services. CDPH offers RH services in the community via the Mobile Health Unit in addition to offering weekly urine based testing clinics at City of Cleveland Recreation Centers.

**Accomplishments**

- 4000 patients seen to date
  - 2967 at RH clinics
  - 1033 at outreach events
- 455 Telehealth visits
- 2956 contraceptives dispensed/administered

- Over 2000 patients received family planning counseling
- Launch Mobile Clinic in March 2025
- Generated \$63,381 in PI

The Title X program is designed to provide access to contraceptive services, supplies and information to all who want and need them. By law, priority is given to persons from low-income families.

**Grant Amount:** \$ 417,000

**Total Budget** \$ 500,000 (\$417,000 + \$83,000 in anticipated program income)

**Grant Term:** April 1, 2026 to March 31, 2028
