



Dear Ms. Hand:

As a Cleveland based location manager in the motion picture industry who has coordinated the filming of 12 motion pictures over the course of the past 13 years in Cleveland, I support the creation of a web based Film permitting process. This would replace the current off line separate construction, traffic, and noise variance permits. A consolidated web based permit would not only stream line the current review and approvals process, but also more efficiently disseminate relevant information to various city departments involved in approving the permit.


The current permit does not ask for a description of activities to be performed (stunts & pyrotechnic information is excluded from the application), crew size, number of vehicles and/or trucks, or temporary structures. A dedicated film permit application could ask for this and other essential information.

The creation of a comprehensive film permit would also eliminate information flow issues that have resulted from out of town location manager's and producer's unfamiliarity with the existing permit process. A web based consolidated permit process that is similar to those used in other film production cities would decrease this user error (the error of omitting relevant information).

The existing permitting process does not easily allow for "rain cover" changes to the filming schedule (when exterior filming is postponed a day or 2 later due to weather). A consolidated and streamlined web based permit could speed up the approval process for such circumstances.

I support your efforts to grow out of state investment into the region via the overhaul of the film permitting process. It will make the process of filming here more efficient, and attract more out of state motion picture investment in Northeast Ohio as a result.




