They will attend community meetings and community events in order to talk to residents and other stakeholders and complete an annual community policing report detailing community policing efforts in each district.

The focus area we will address is building legitimacy and trust. We will create Neighborhood Response Groups (eNeRGy) assigned to Cleveland's five police districts and working under the direction of each district's Commander. Officers will be in groups of six with one group for each of the five districts.

District Commanders are keenly aware of neighborhood issues and will assign their group to a single neighborhood until it is appropriate to move them to the next neighborhood.

The officers will employ community problem-oriented policing methods to engage the community and build trust. They will walk beats and ride bikes. They will be highly visible and directly engage stakeholders including community members, business owners, neighborhood groups, and community leaders. They will attend community meetings and events and complete an annual community policing report detailing community policing efforts in each District. This report will describe the problems and solutions identified.

The officers will work with the community on quality of life issues such as vacant homes, abandoned vehicles, graffiti, gambling, prostitution, dumping, etc. They will handle the problems themselves instead of calling for a zone car or detective. The idea is to be visible and engage the community while helping to alleviate the low-level issues that take time to address, and not burdening patrol and other units. Over time, when the community sees that they are consistent and engaging, they will provide them with investigative or enforcement information. Again, the focus will be on the more minor issues to build trust.

Importantly, they will assist all basic patrol officers with utilizing community policing techniques.

This approach allows us to continue implementing our long-term strategy of ensuring every officer is a community policing officer and that community policing techniques and philosophies become more entrenched in the culture of the Division of Police.

Team officers will work directly with community stakeholders, employing problem-oriented policing (POP) methods. They will focus on helping the community identify and address the criminal activity in their neighborhoods. They will engage stakeholders at community events, and help other officers use POP methods in basic patrol.
