AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to donate approximately two hundred ballistic vests and various non-controlled medications for humanitarian use in Ukraine by first responders; and to enter into one or more agreements if necessary to make such donations.

WHEREAS, Section 181.19 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, authorizes the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies to sell personal property owned by the City of Cleveland when no longer needed nor suitable for the use of any department or office of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City owns approximately two hundred ballistic vests, which are no longer needed for public use, and desires to donate them to the Ohio National Guard for use by first responders in Ukraine for rescue efforts (“Ukrainian Rescue Humanitarian Efforts”); and

WHEREAS, the City also owns various non-controlled medications, which are no longer needed for public use, and desires to donate them to one or more public or private entities for the Ukrainian Rescue Humanitarian Efforts; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That, notwithstanding and as an exception to Section 181.19 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976 and upon concurrence by the Board of Control, the Director of Public Safety is authorized to donate approximately two hundred ballistic vests, which are no longer needed for public use, to the Ohio National Guard, and to donate various non-controlled medications, which are no longer needed for public use, to one or more public or private entities, for the Ukrainian Rescue Humanitarian Efforts; and to enter into one or more agreements if necessary to make such donations.

Section 2. That any agreements shall be prepared by the Director of Law.

Section 3. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
