- 100% AMI (\$73,700 for household of 4)
- Citywide
- Application

- Maximum voucher = \$1,500

- Annual Budget

- \$500,000 General Funds

- Participant Requirements

- Application
- **PROVIDE THEIR OWN LABOR**
- Lead abatement safety course

# Expanding Exterior Paint Program


- **Grant program for paint, supplies and labor**

- **Eligibility**
  - **100% AMI (\$73,700 for household of 4)**
  - **Rotate through Community Engagement Specialist Area**
  - **Structurally sound homes in need of paint only**
- **Budget**
  - **\$500,000 General Funds**
- **Goal**
  - **50 Homes**




### D- and F-Grade Structures
