**SUBJECT:** Ordinance 570-2022 authorizing the Director of Public Safety to apply for and

accept funds from the Bureau of Justice Assistance for the FY21 Byrne Criminal Justice Initiative; and to enter into one or more contracts with the Task Force on Violent Crime Charitable Fund dba Partnership for a Safer Cleveland and Case Western Reserve University to implement the grant

## **Purpose:**

Ordinance No. 570-2022, if approved by City Council, would authorize the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant in the amount of \$986,293 from the Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance for the FY18 Community-Based Crime Reduction (CBCR) Grant.

This grant will provide funding to develop and implement a crime reduction program in the Buckeye-Woodhill neighborhood. Surveys and meetings will be conducted with community members and other key stakeholders before the final crime reduction plan is implemented.
