Legislative Summary
Emergency Public Shelter Relief

DIVISION: Recreation

ORDINANCE NO: 662-2022

DESCRIPTION: An emergency ordinance authorizing the Directors of Public Works and Public Safety to enter into one or more contracts with the American National Red Cross (“Red Cross”) for an emergency shelter relief plan using the City’s recreation centers and other suitable City facilities, for a period not to exceed two years.

LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE: Passage of this legislation is necessary to help those who have been displaced by disasters or other emergencies which would necessitate the evacuation and mass care of those affected; on a temporary basis, as emergency public shelter during a disaster.

CONTRACT TERMS: For a thirty (30) day period

FUNDING SOURCE The Red Cross will reimburse for damages, costs associated with custodial and food service personnel and out-of-pocket operational costs such as water, gas, electricity and waste disposal.
