## Ordinance No. 1045-2022

#### AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Port Control to employ one or more professional consultants to install, set-up, configure, and implement an updated Common Use Passenger Processing System at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, and for related services; authorizing the purchase by one or more contracts of the system, for a period of one year with four one-year options to renew, exercisable by the Director of Port Control.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to employ by contract or contracts one or more consultants or one or more firms of consultants for the purpose of supplementing the regularly employed staff of the several departments of the City of Cleveland in order to provide professional services necessary to install, set-up, configure, and implement an updated Common Use Passenger Processing System at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, and for related services, including but not limited to, removing the old system, providing the new system, project management, related hardware and software, networking, and training, and for maintenance and support, for a period of one year with four one-year options to renew, exercisable by the Director of Port Control.

The selection of the consultant or consultants for the services shall be made by the Board of Control on the nomination of the Director of Port Control from a list of qualified consultants available for employment as may be determined after a full and complete canvass by the Director of Port Control for the purpose of compiling a list. The compensation to be paid for the services shall be fixed by the Board of Control. The contract or contracts authorized shall be prepared by the Director of Law, approved by the Director of Port Control, and certified by the Director of Finance.

Section 2. That, unless obtained under the professional services contract authorized above, the Director of Port Control is authorized to make one or more written contracts under the Charter and the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, for each or all of the following items: Common Use Passenger Processing System

and related equipment and software to be purchased by the Commissioner of Purchases

and Supplies for a gross price, for the Division of Airports, Department of Port Control.

Section 3. That under Section 108(b) of the Charter, the purchases authorized

by this ordinance may be made through cooperative arrangements with other

governmental agencies. The Director of Port Control may sign all documents that are

necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the

vendors selected through that cooperative process.

<u>Section 4.</u> That the cost of the contract or contracts authorized shall be paid

from Fund Nos. 60 SF 001 and 60 SF 141. (RQS 3001, RL 2022-72)

<u>Section 5.</u> That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by

the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
