Ordinance No. 443-2023

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Port Control to exercise the option to renew Contract No. LS2018-021 with the United States of America for the lease of certain space in the terminal at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport for the purpose of general office, break rooms, and storage in support of the passenger security checkpoints and other essential security needs in conjunction with the operation of the airport.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Ordinance No. 674-18, passed July 18, 2018, the Director of Port Control entered into Contract No. LS2018-021 with the United States of America, acting through the General Services Administration on behalf of the Transportation Security Administration ("United States of America") for the lease of certain space in the terminal at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport ("Leased Premises") for the purpose of general office, break rooms, and storage in support of the passenger security checkpoints and other essential security needs in conjunction with the operation of the airport; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 674-18 requires further legislation before exercising the option to renew on this contract; and

WHEREAS, for the use of the Leased Premises, the United States of America shall pay the City an annual fee as specified in the contract; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the Director of Port Control is authorized to exercise the option to renew Contract No. LS2018-021 with the United States of America for the lease of certain space in the terminal at Cleveland Hopkins international Airport for the purpose of general office, break rooms, and storage in support of the passenger security checkpoints and other essential security needs in conjunction with the operation of the airport. This ordinance constitutes the additional legislative authority required by Ordinance No. 674-18 to exercise this option.

<u>Section 2.</u> That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


