SUBJECT: Ordinance No. 1355-2024 Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant from the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services for the FY 2023 Ohio Drug Law Enforcement Grant to provide funding for the operation of the Cartel Gang Narcotics and Laundering Task Force; and authorizing agreements with various entities to implement the grant

Ordinance No. 1355-1014, if approved by Council, authorizes the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant in the amount of \$136,875.79 from the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services for the FY23 Ohio Drug Law Enforcement Fund Grant. This legislation would provide funding for the operation of the Cartel Gang Narcotics & Laundering Task Force (CGNL), which was formerly known as the Northern Ohio Law Enforcement Task Force (NOLETF). This grant requires a cash match of \$45,625.26. The total budget is \$182,501.05.

Purpose of Grant:

The goal of the Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services Justice Assistance Grant is to provide funding to law enforcement agencies for operating multi-agency task forces. The City of Cleveland will be reimbursed for costs associated with operating the CGNL Task Force. CGNL is a multi-agency drug task force that brings together local, state, and agents and investigators to ensure the most sophisticated investigation and prosecution resources are directed against organized drug trafficking groups.

The agencies that partner in CGNL include: Cleveland Division of Police, Federal Bureau of Investigation, the U.S. Attorney's Office (Northern District of Ohio), Internal Revenue Service, U.S. Customs and the Border Patrol, U.S. Coast Guard, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation, Ohio Adult Parole Authority, Ohio State Highway Patrol, Cuyahoga County Sheriff, Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office, Ottawa County Drug Task Force, Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority Police, Bedford Police, Brooklyn Police, Independence Police, Moreland Hills Police, North Royalton Police, Parma Police, and Shaker Heights Police.
