AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the issuance of a Mobile Permit to Desmond Mattox of IGS Energy to engage in mobile vending in Ward 2.

FOR PASSAGE September 10, 2018

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 675.07 of the Codified Ordinances of Cleveland, Ohio, 1976, (the "Codified Ordinances") the consent of Council expressed by ordinance is a prerequisite to peddling upon public rights of way outside of the Central Business District; and

WHEREAS, This Council has considered the request of Desmond Mattox of IGS Energy to engage in mobile vending outside of the Central Business district, and has determined that it is in the public interest to allow Desmond Mattox of IGS Energy to engage in mobile vending in Ward 2; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

<u>Section 1.</u> That this Council consents, as required by, Section 675.08 of the Codified Ordinances to allow to Desmond Mattox of IGS Energy to engage in mobile vending in the public rights of way in Ward 2.

Section 2. That all of the requirements of Chapter 675 of the Codified Ordinances shall apply to the persons named in Section 1 of this ordinance.

<u>Section 3.</u> That the privilege granted may be revoked at any time by this Council.

<u>Section 4.</u> That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
