

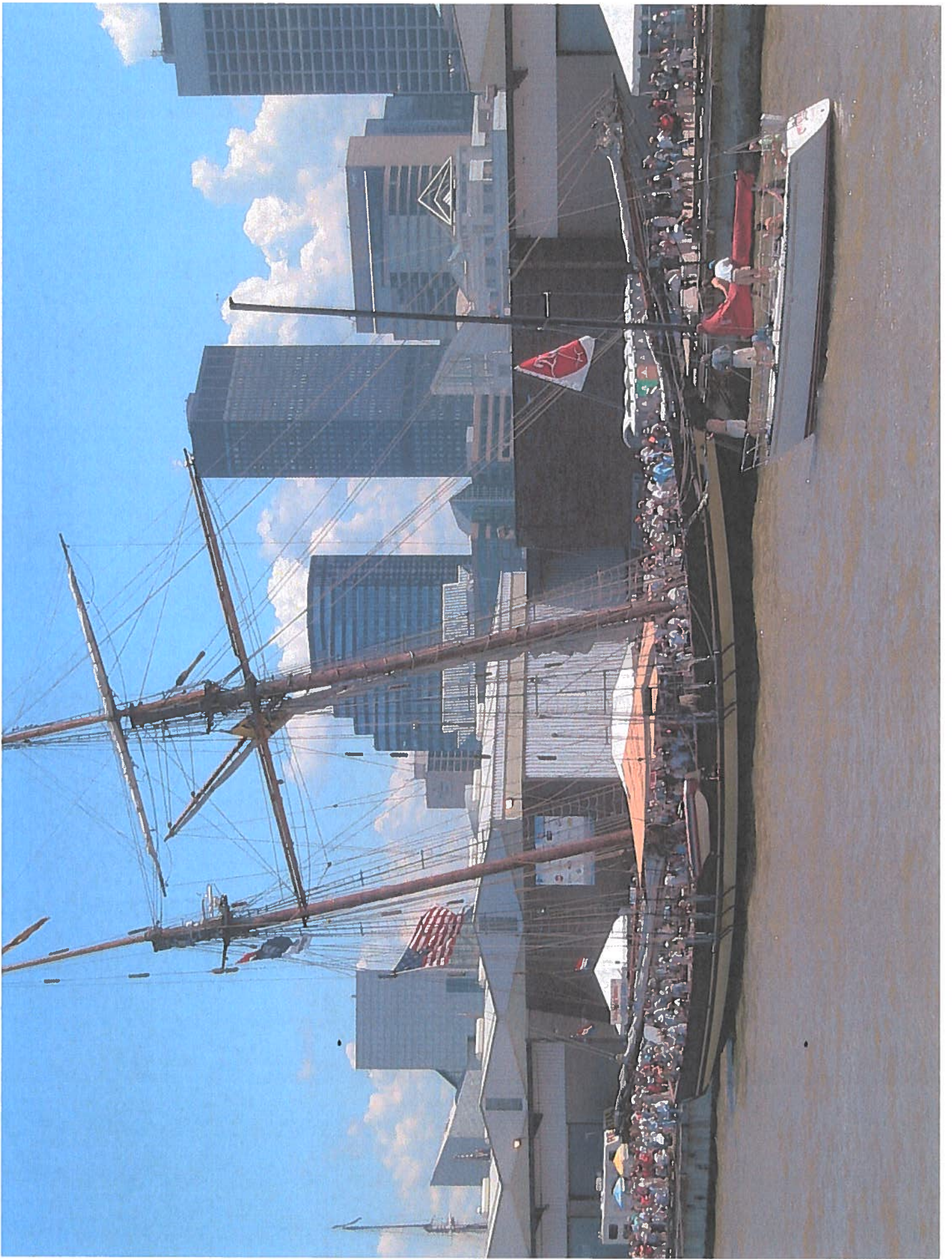

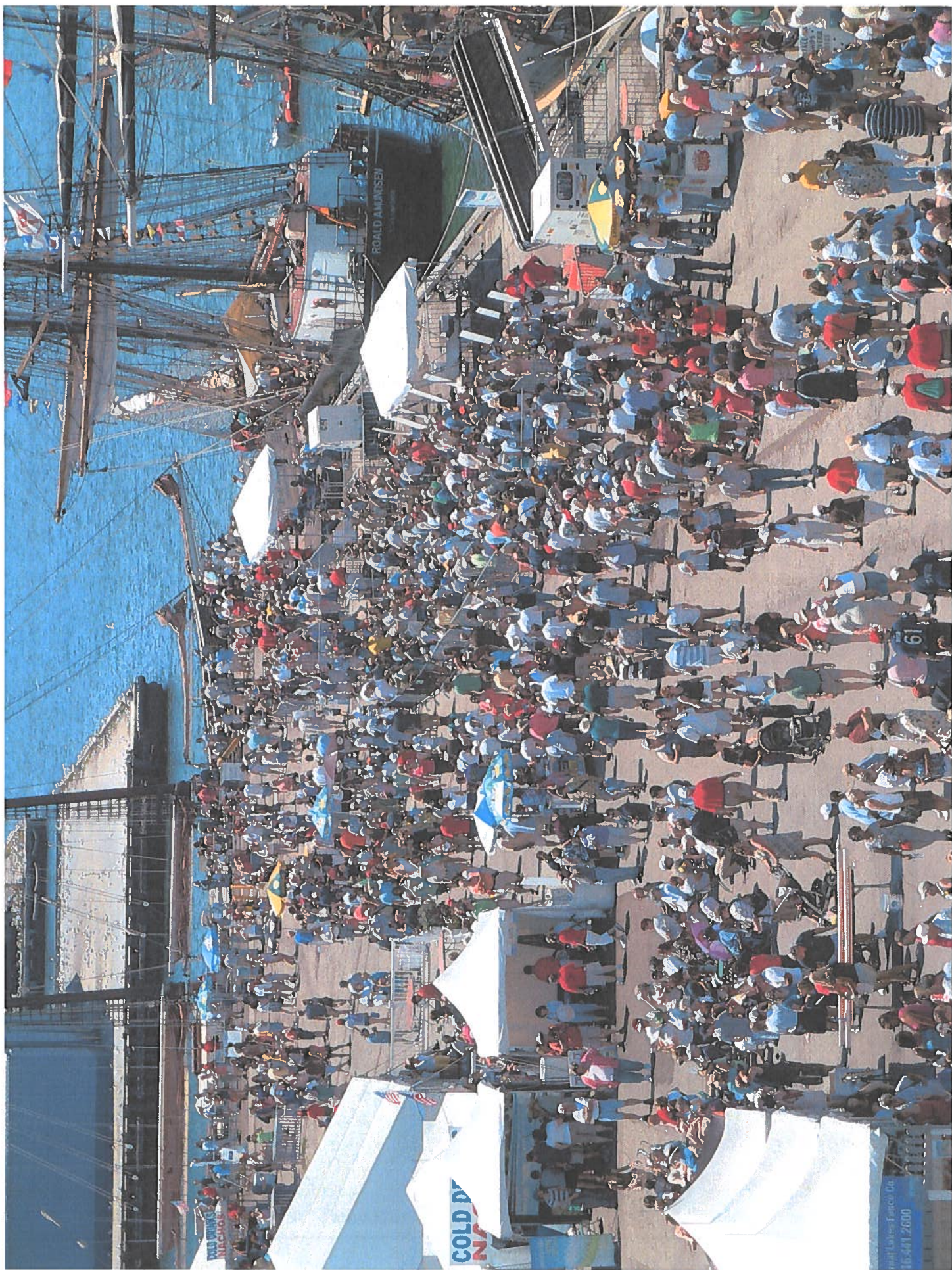

- Interface with USCG regarding safety and regulatory structure for sailing ships, including the Sailing School Vessels act of 1982 and subsequent regulations



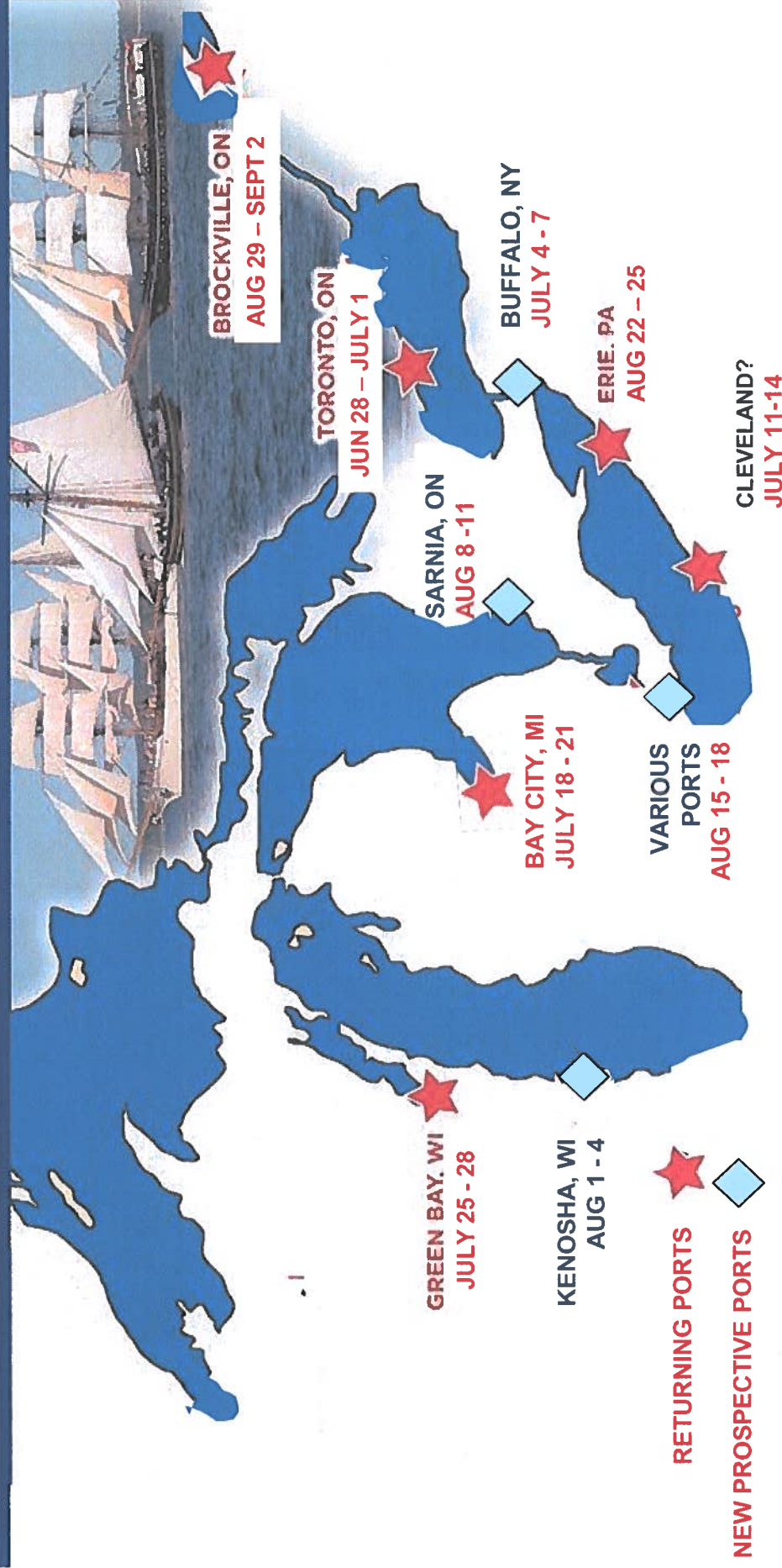
The TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® Race Series

- Series of sailing races, cruises, and maritime festivals organized by TALL SHIPS AMERICA in conjunction with US and Canadian ports on all four coasts.
- Traditionally-rigged sailing vessels from Canada, the US and other countries are crewed by youth (civilians or cadets) ages 13 - 25 who are engaged in sail training programs under the supervision of captains and professional crewmembers.
- Maritime festivals in each host port give visitors a chance to board the tall ships and meet the crew and trainees and learn about the many varied opportunities to sail and travel on member vessels.

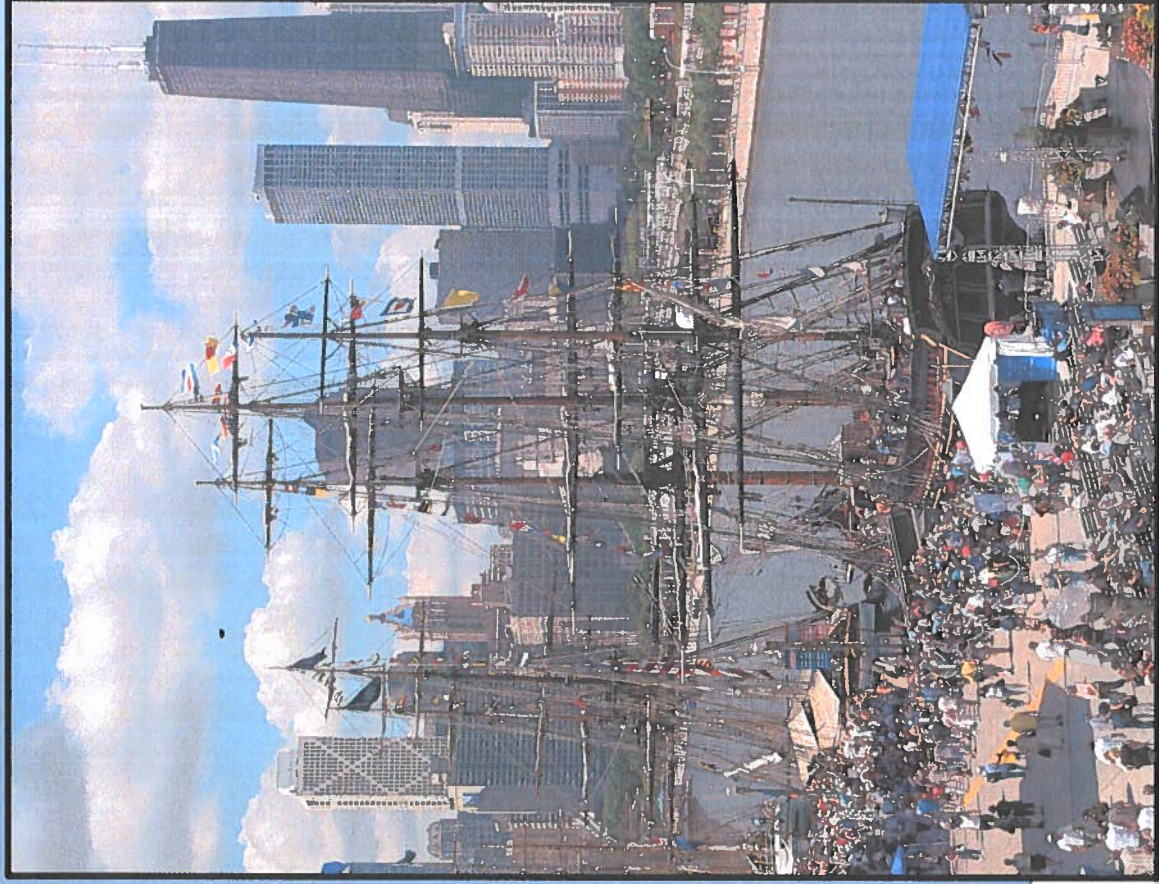


TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® Race Series Great Lakes 2019

Past Tall Ship Festival Average Attendance/Year



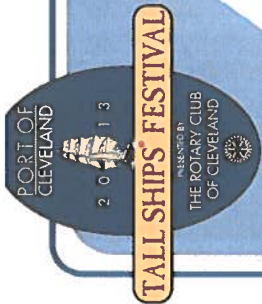
