Abstract

Applicant: City of Cleveland

Project Title: The Central Connection

<u>Target Neighborhood</u>: The Central neighborhood. Zip codes are 44103, 44104 and 44106. It is within the boundaries of Euclid Ave to the north, Woodland Ave to the south, E 22nd St to the west and E 71th to the east. The population is 306,830.

<u>Funding from Other Federal Investments</u>: The neighborhood does not receive any other Federal investments.

Summary of Research Plan:

At the start of the planning process, the Begun Center for Violence Prevention, Research and Education will gather data regarding crime, disorder, and community demographics through a community-based participatory research and decision-making process. CCI will be data-driven and engage residents, cross-sector partners, and the CCI Management Team. There will be regular meetings at various levels, advancing and monitoring all activities and strategies during the development and implementation stages.

A multimodal evaluation design will utilize benchmark data over time comparing target and comparison sites on variables such as gun crime, weapons-related offenses, shootings and killings, and variables prescribed by BJA performance measure guidelines. Offense data will be geocoded over months of active outreach in target sites and also in comparison sites. Geocoded data maps create a visualization of crime type by location and rate; statistical analysis of longitudinal crime data will supplement geocoded data.

An evaluation design will go beyond crime analysis and examine the relationship between prevention activity and its effects on the Central neighborhood. The Begun Center will create an evaluation design to meet BJA mandates and a high standard of professionalism. Interim reports and a final report will be provided in a timely manner; datasets will be cleaned and submitted; and all evaluation requirements will be met. Cleveland and CMHA Police will maintain crime data for the focused area. Program partners will collect data on services they provide including participant numbers and successful completions as well intended and unintended outcomes.

To assist the Department of Justice in fulfilling its responsibilities under the Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA), Begun Center researchers will be responsible for providing data to the City of Cleveland for submission to the DOJ for calculating performance measures and to submit performance data through the Bureau of Justice Assistance's (BJA) Performance Measurement Tool (PMT). Examples of performance measure data that we will gather and submit through PMT include, but are not limited to, the following:

Number of partnerships formed

Amount of resources leveraged from partners (e.g., funding, time, staffing, etc.)

Number of active program participants

Number of instances where data is used to inform policies

Number of instances where data/research findings are used to inform programming

· Community involvement levels

The above performance metrics will be established prior to program commencement (baseline), with every quarter being charted after programming begins. Ongoing monitoring of performance metrics will allow Begun Center researchers to regularly submit data using the PMT. Begun Center researchers understand that the above measures are only initial examples of performance measures for the project. Researchers understand that once funding is awarded, specific measures will be finalized with BJA and program staff.

Fiscal Agent: City of Cleveland

<u>Full-Time Project Coordinator</u>: A full-time project coordinator will be hired. The position will be managed by Partnership for a Safer Cleveland (Cross-Sector Partner).

Four local philanthropic organizations: Sisters of Charity, Third Federal Foundation, Cleveland Foundation, and St. Luke's Foundation, are already providing funding or have committed to providing additional funding and/or support to this project.

Major economic revitalization and development efforts are being completed around the target neighborhood. Developers and businesses will hire from the target neighborhood once the neighborhood is safer and stabilized.

The Standing Together Against Neighborhood Crime Everyday (STANCE) committee is well-established through a 12 year collaborative process. Headed by the Northeast Ohio U.S. Attorney, the STANCE Executive Committee will lead the efforts of the project.

The Begun Center of Case Western Reserve University (Begun) is the research partner of the Cleveland Division of Police. Begun researchers will lead development of a comprehensive plan for the Central area by identifying the drivers of crime through collection and analysis of police data, survey residents to determine community priorities, assist in determining outcome and performance measures, and recommend appropriate activities and strategies for implementation. Researchers will develop data collection tools, assist with establishment of baseline data, analyze collected data, and provide updates to Management Team for continual improvement of program.

To complement and help sustain the Central Connection Initiative, Begun will add a full-time data analyst position dedicated to analyzing data and identifying crime issues Cleveland Division of Police and the Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Administration Police Department.
