SUBJECT: Ordinance No. 1286-18 Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to Apply for and Accept a grant from U.S. Department of Justice for the FY18 Federal Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant – Local Solicitation and to enter into one or more contracts to implement the grant

Ordinance No. 1286-18 would authorize the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice for the FY2018 Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). If approved by Council, the legislation will provide funding for personnel for the Division of Police. The legislation authorizes one or more contracts with Cuyahoga County and the cities of Euclid, Garfield Heights, and East Cleveland for the implementation of the program.

Purpose of Grant:

The goal of the Justice Assistance Grant is to provide funding for equipment, services and personnel to advance basic law enforcement efforts. The City of Cleveland was selected by the grant recipients, Cuyahoga County and the cities of Cleveland Heights, Euclid, Garfield Heights, and East Cleveland to be the fiscal agent on behalf of the cities and the County. The funding will be divided as follows:

City of Cleveland:	\$451,841
Cuyahoga County:	100,000
Garfield Hts:	10,377
Euclid:	16,896
East Cleveland:	<u>11,674</u>
TOTAL:	<u>\$590,788</u>

The funding provided to the City of Cleveland will be used to maintain personnel.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant from the United States Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance for the FY 2018 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Local Solicitation; and authorizing one or more contracts with Cuyahoga County and the cities of East Cleveland, Euclid, Garfield Heights, and Cleveland Heights needed to implement the grant.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to apply for and accept a grant in the approximate amount of \$590,788, and any other funds that may become available during the grant term from the United States Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Assistance to conduct the FY 2018 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Local Solicitation; that the director is authorized to file all papers and execute all documents necessary to receive the funds under the grant; and that the funds are appropriated for the purposes described in the grant application for the grant contained in the file described below.

Section 2. That the grant application, File No. 1286-18-A, made a part of this ordinance as if fully rewritten, as presented to the Finance Committee of this Council at the public hearing on this legislation, is approved in all respects and shall not be changed without additional legislative authority.

Section 3. That the Director of Public Safety shall have the authority to extend the term of the grant during the grant term.

Section 4. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to enter into one or more contracts with Cuyahoga County and the cities of East Cleveland, Euclid, Garfield Heights, and Cleveland Heights needed to implement the grant as described in the file.

Section 5. That, unless expressly prohibited by the grant agreement, under Section 108(b) of the Charter, purchases made under the grant agreement may be made through cooperative arrangements with other governmental agencies. The

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Director of Public Safety may sign all documents and do all things that are necessary to make the purchases, and may enter into one or more contracts with the vendors selected through that cooperative process.

Section 6. That the costs of the contracts authorized by this ordinance shall be paid from the fund or funds to which are credited the grant proceeds accepted under this ordinance.

Section 7. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
