Ordinance No. 1287-18 would authorize the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant in the amount of \$100,000 from the Cleveland Police Foundation for the Fourth District Community Policing Program. Funding will be used to pay overtime for officers to provide additional services in the Fourth District. They will attend community events and focus on quality of life issues.

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Public Safety to apply for and accept a grant from the Cleveland Police Foundation for the Fourth District Community Policing Project Program.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to apply for and accept a grant in the approximate amount of \$100,000, and any other funds that may become available during the grant term from the Cleveland Police Foundation to conduct the Fourth District Community Policing Project; that the Director is authorized to file all papers and execute all documents necessary to receive the funds under the grant; and that the funds are appropriated for the purposes described in the application for the grant contained in the file described below.

Section 2. That the application for the grant, File No. 1287-18-A, made a part of this ordinance as if fully rewritten, is approved in all respects and shall not be changed without additional legislative authority.

Section 3. That the Director of Public Safety is authorized to extend the term of the grant.

Section 4. That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
