**SUBJECT:** Ordinance No. 71-2019 To amend the title and Sections 4 and 5 of Ordinance No. 184-18, passed March 26, 2018, relating to applying for and accepting a grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for the FY 17 Port Security Grant Program; to supplement the ordinance by adding new Sections 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 to add professional services, public improvement, and standard contracts, necessary to design and install security enhancements and upgrades to various lift bridges and any other agreements; and to renumber existing Sections 6 and 7 to new Sections 12, and 13

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Ordinance No. 71-2019, if approved by Council, would amend Ord. No. 184-18 to also authorize the Director of Public Works to enter into various written standard purchase or requirement contracts needed to implement the FY17 Port Security Grant. The Department of Public Works will determine the method of making the public improvement of installing security enhancements and upgrades to various lift bridges under this grant.

Background information on the FY17 Port Security Program is as follows:

The FY17 Port Security Grant Program will provide funding for bridge security enhancements to increase the security of Lift Bridges which are part of the Port of Cleveland. The grant will fund a CCTV system that will be readily available to Homeland Security, the US Coast Guard, the Cleveland Division of Police and any other authorized enforcement agency. These enhancements will enable a quicker response to events on waterways and will provide reviewable video of incidents that occur on the bridges and will assist in preventing unauthorized personnel from sensitive areas that are not open to public access. This will improve our ability to deter, detect and disrupt potential terrorist or criminal activities. The anticipated grant award is \$518,928.32 and requires matching funds of \$172,976.12 for a total of \$691,904.42. The matching funds will be provided by Capital Project C18203. The period of the grant is from October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2019.
