### AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION

Declaring the intent to vacate a portion of West 48<sup>th</sup> Street and a portion of relocated Turn Avenue S.W.

WHEREAS, this Council is satisfied that there is good cause to vacate a portion of

West 48th Street and relocated Turn Avenue S.W., as described; and

WHEREAS, this resolution constitutes an emergency measure providing for the

usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

<u>Section 1.</u> That this Council declares its intent to vacate a portion of the

following described real property:

#### A portion of West 48<sup>th</sup> Street

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio and known as being a portion of West 48<sup>th</sup> Street (60.00 feet wide) of part of the Taylor and Hoyt Allotment as shown in Volume 1, Page 20 of Cuyahoga County Map Records further described as follows:

Being all that portion of West 48<sup>th</sup> Street (60.00 feet wide) extending from the south line of Lorain Avenue S.W. (99.00 feet wide) southerly to its intersection with the westerly prolongation of the south line of relocated Turn Avenue S.W. (40.00 feet wide) as shown in Map 3176 of the City of Cleveland Map Records.

#### A portion of Turn Avenue S.W.

Situated in the City of Cleveland, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio and known as being a portion of relocated Turn Avenue S.W. (40.00 feet wide) as shown in Map 3176 of the City of Cleveland Map Records further described as follows:

Being all that portion of said Turn Avenue S.W. (40.00 feet wide) extending from the East line of West 48<sup>th</sup> Street (60.00 feet wide) to the southerly prolongation of the West line of West 48<sup>th</sup> Place (14.00 feet wide).

Legal Description approved by Greg Esber, Section Chief, Plats, Surveys and House Numbering Section.

<u>Section 2.</u> That this resolution is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
