<u>Family Life/Community Forum</u> – This program is designed to improve the quality of life of the neighborhood residents and to offer community groups the opportunity to utilize the facility for meetings and public service events.

- > Programs primary users are ages 8-18
- > Teaches backhand, lob and forehand shot, how to serve, rules of a single and double games, and scoring
- > Tennis Sessions are provided in am and pm sessions. AM sessions are held from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon and PM Sessions are held from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm.
