



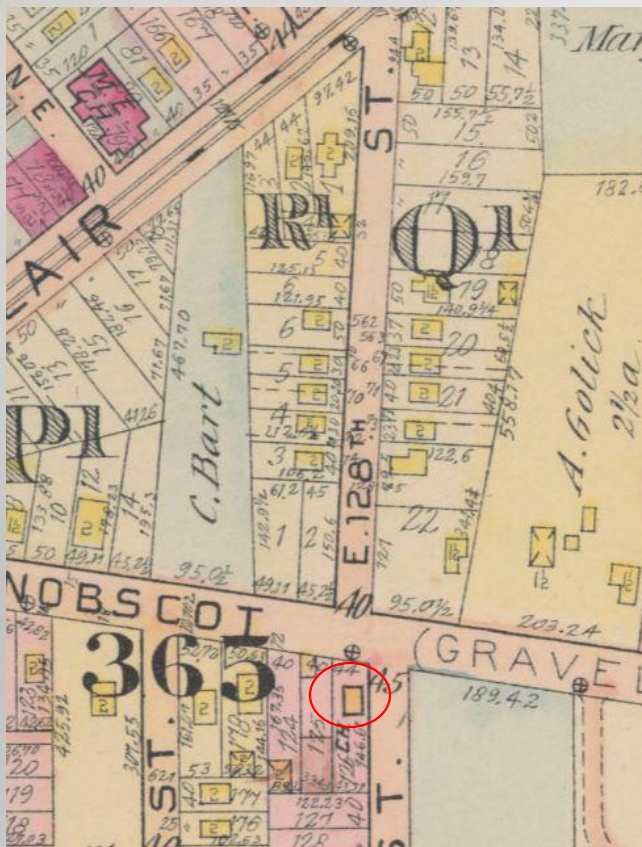

CHURCH HISTORY

Cleveland City Church Extension and
Missionary Society of the Methodist
Episcopal Church

Organized July 1, 1902 with 14 members
and 4 probationers

Original location at the corner of
Penobscot and Euclid View Avenues

BUILDING HISTORY

- ❖ Purchased the property at the corner of St. Clair and Lancelot Avenues in January 1909
- ❖ Hired the firm of Maurer & Mills as the architects
- ❖ Together as a firm from 1909-1915
 - Designed several churches including the Glenville Seventh Day Adventist Church (Designated Landmark 2018)

BUILDING HISTORY

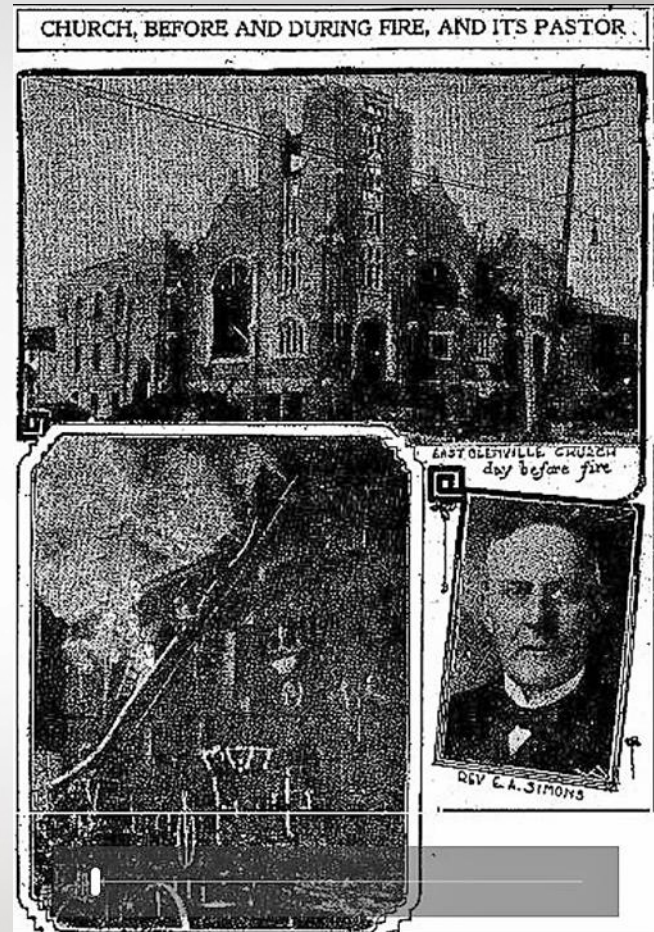
- ❖ Cornerstone laid on October 1, 1911
 - Airing & Sons Masonry Contractors
 - James Lawson Carpentry Contractor
- ❖ Membership was up to 179 with 15 probationers and Sunday school attendance of 241
- ❖ Church being built to accommodate 350 worshipers and 600 for Sunday school

❖ January 13, 1912 the unfinished building suffered a fire caused by plaster dryers.

❖ The damage was not too significant and only delayed construction briefly

❖ Building was dedicated on June 15, 1912

❖ Cost \$34,000 (\$862,400 in 2019)
