Ordinance No. 999-2019

FOR PASSAGE August 21, 2019

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Port Control to enter into one or more contracts without competitive bidding with Anthony Allega Cement Contractors Inc. for the purchase of labor, equipment, and materials necessary to replace damaged fiber optic lines and remove and replace the damaged duct bank at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport.

WHEREAS, a duct bank containing a fiber optic line was damaged at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport during construction of a project and needs to be removed and replaced and the fiber optic line needs to be replaced; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Port Control has recommended that, based on considerations of cost, quality, safety, security, and delivery date, the City should contract with Anthony Allega Cement Contractors, Inc. to provide the necessary labor and equipment, and materials to replace damaged fiber optic lines and remove and replace the damaged duct bank at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Port Control is authorized to make one or more written contracts with Anthony Allega Cement Contractors, Inc. for the necessary labor and equipment, and materials to replace damaged fiber optic lines and remove and replace the damaged duct bank at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, for a gross price estimated at \$168,700.00 for the Department of Port Control.

Section 2. That the cost of the contract or contracts authorized shall be paid from Fund Nos. 60 SF 001, 60 SF 104, 60 SF 106, 60 SF 112, 60 SF 114, 60 SF 117, 60 SF 119, 60 SF 121, 60 SF 122, 60 SF 126, 60 SF 141, and from the fund or funds to which are credited any grants received for this purpose and any passenger facility charges that include this purpose. (RQS 3001, RL 2019-78)

<u>Section 3.</u> That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
