AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Approving the collective bargaining agreement with International Local 100, AFSCME Ohio Council 8 AFL-CIO; and to amend Section 8 of Ordinance No. 323-15, passed March 30, 2015, as amended, relating to compensation for various classifications.

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That under division (B) of Section 4117.10 of the Revised Code, this Council approves the collective bargaining agreement with International Local 100, AFSCME Ohio Council 8 AFL-CIO, under the terms contained in **File No. 690-2020-A**, for the period from April 1, 2019 through March 31, 2022, and which provides, among other things, for an increase in the salaries and wages for members of the bargaining unit under the following schedule:

That Section 8 of Ordinance No. 323-15, passed March 30, 2015, as amended by Ordinance No. 491-15, passed May 4, 2015, Ordinance No. 707-16, passed July 13, 2016, Ordinance No. 19-17, passed January 23, 2017, Ordinance No. 359-17, passed April 10, 2017, Ordinance No. 822-17, passed July 12, 2017, Ordinance No. 83-18, passed February 12, 2018, Ordinance No. 320-18, passed March 26, 2018, Ordinance No. 730-18, passed June 4, 2018, Ordinance No. 1324-18, passed November 12, 2018, Ordinance No. 665-2019, passed June 3, 2019, and Ordinance No. 1541-2019, passed January 6, 2020, is amended to read as follows:
