- Reviewed proposals/applications received from homeless service providers interested in receiving ESG & CDBG funds

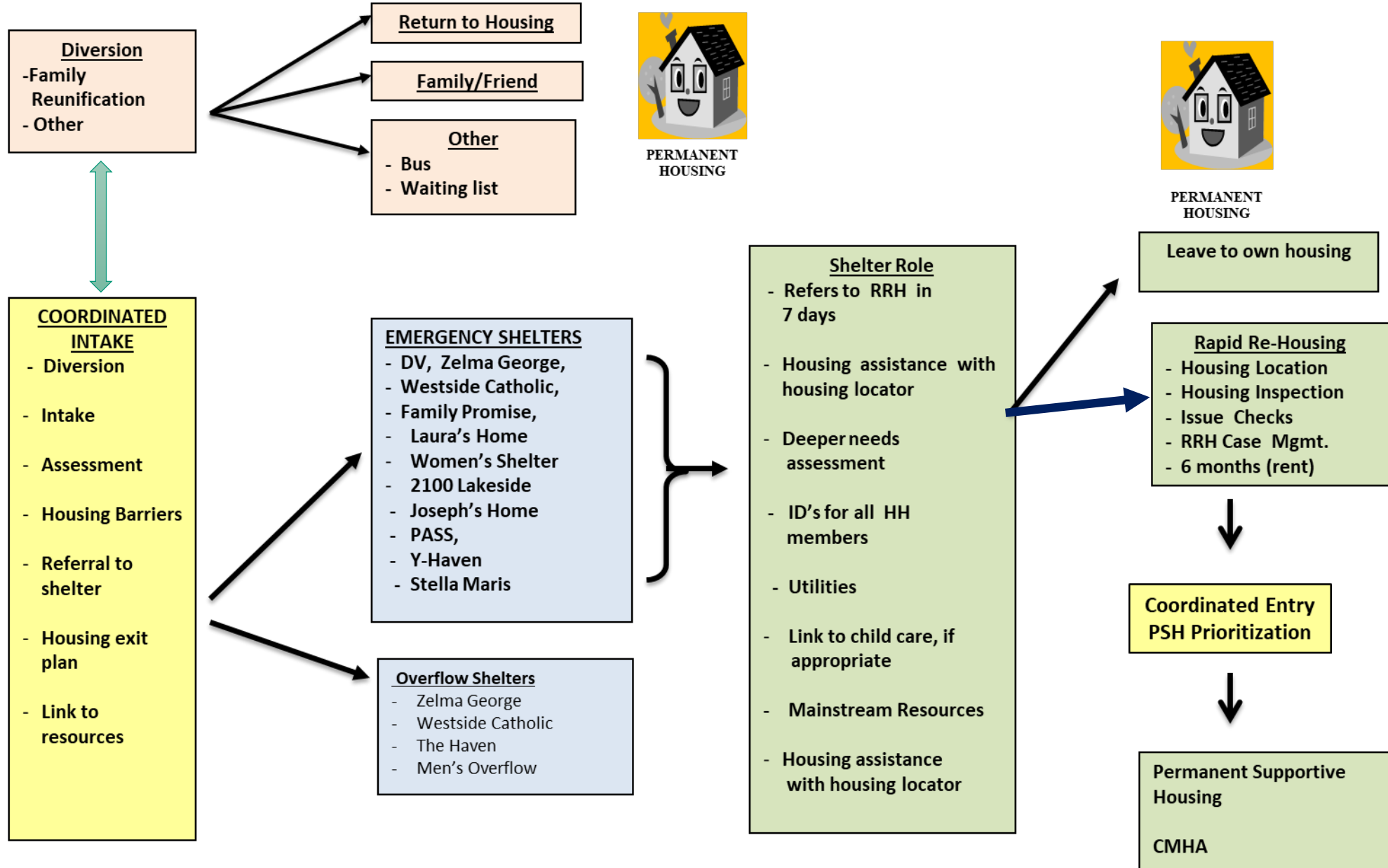

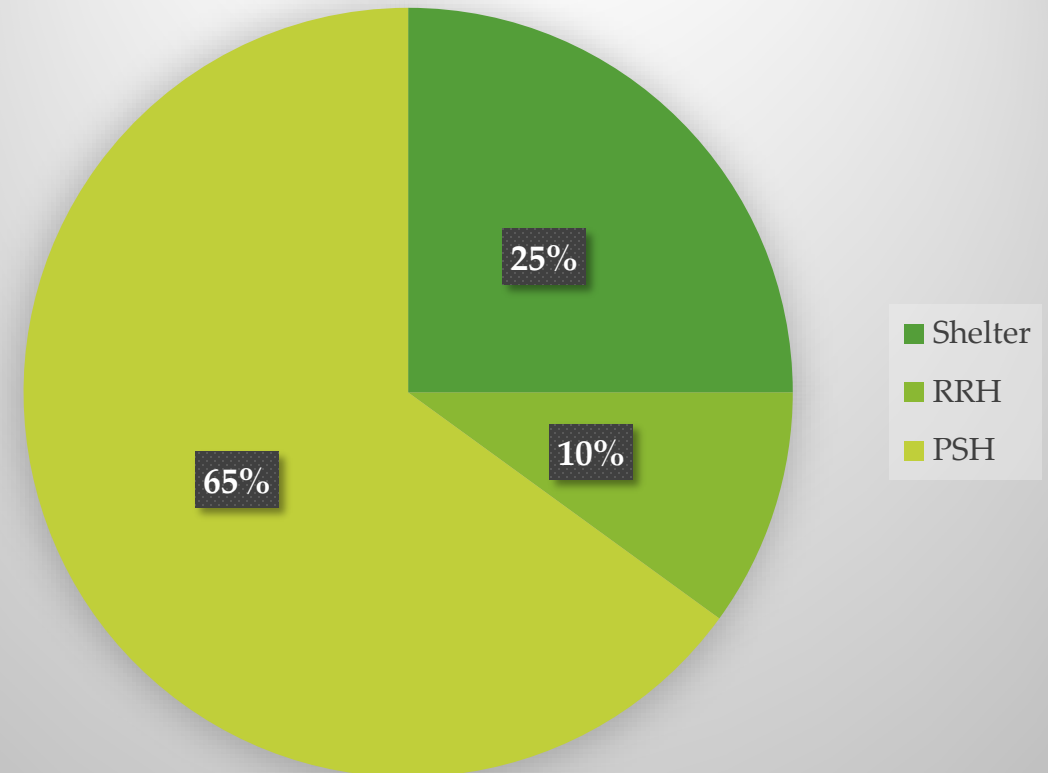

Number of Households Housed through RRH in 2020

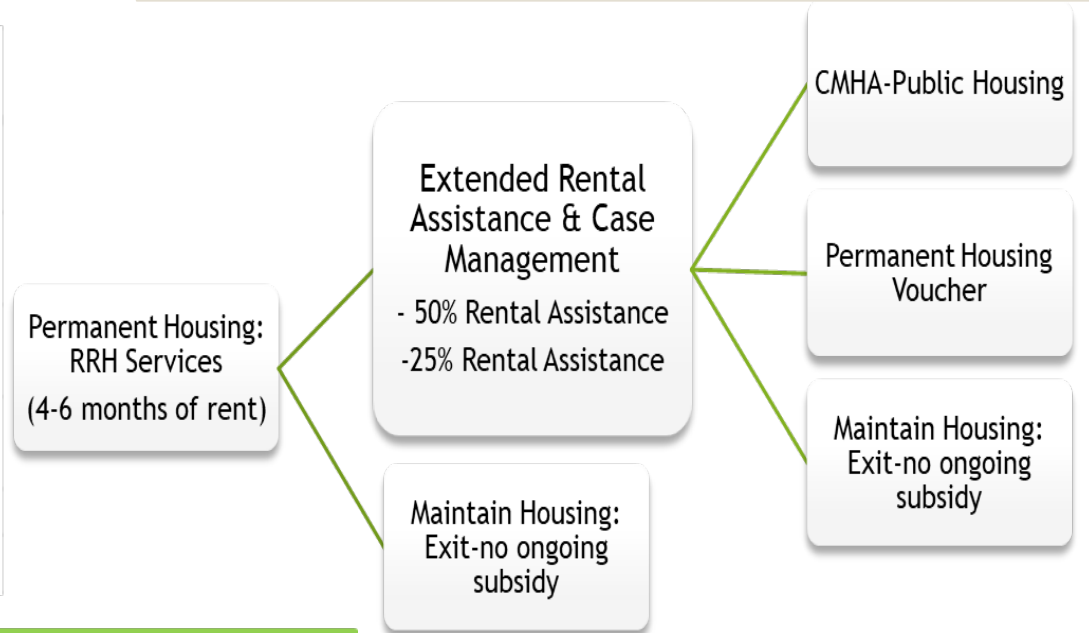

- Used to serve Survivors of DV and households fleeing Domestic Violence.
- Received 27 Referrals so far
- Housed 9 Households so far
