# Ordinance No. 453-2021

By Council Members Gray, Bishop and Kelley (by departmental request)

### AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Director of Capital Projects to enter into one or more agreements with SCAR, LLC, or its designee(s), to remove and retain the sidewalks around Woodland Cemetery on East 66<sup>th</sup> Street and East 71<sup>st</sup> Street between Woodland Avenue and Quincy Avenue, in exchange for labor and services to install new sidewalks and to accept as a gift to the City the services that exceed the value of the current sidewalks.

WHEREAS, the sandstone sidewalks around Woodland Cemetery on East 66<sup>th</sup> Street and East 71<sup>st</sup> Street between Woodland Avenue and Quincy Avenue are in poor condition, and SCAR, LLC has expressed a desire to obtain such sidewalks and has offered in exchange to provide the labor and related services necessary to remove such sidewalks and to install the concrete and stone provided by the City to replace such sidewalks;

WHEREAS, SCAR, LLC's proposal will result in the City receiving new concrete sidewalk valued at \$198,260 while expending approximately \$60,000 in material (concrete and aggregate); SCAR, LLC will provide labor and related services and will salvage the existing sandstone sidewalks,

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes an emergency measure providing for the usual daily operation of a municipal department; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLEVELAND:

Section 1. That the Director of Capital Projects is authorized to enter into one or more agreements with SCAR, LLC, or its designee(s), to removal and retain the sandstone sidewalks around Woodland Cemetery on East 66<sup>th</sup> Street and East 71<sup>st</sup> Street between Woodland Avenue and Quincy Avenue, in exchange for the labor and any related services necessary to install the concrete and stone provided by the City to replace such sidewalks and to accept, as a gift to the City, the donation of such services that exceed the value of such sandstone sidewalks. The agreement or agreements shall be prepared by the Director of Law and shall contain additional terms and conditions that the Director deems necessary to protect and benefit the public interest.

<u>Section 2.</u> That this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
