Executive Summary MomsFirst and Invest in Children Partnership

Background/Purpose:

This legislation authorizes the Director of Public Health to apply for and accept a grant from the Cuyahoga County Invest in Children Program and authorizes the Director to enter into contracts with various agencies, entities and individuals to carry out MomsFirst Project services. MomsFirst is able to expand its service capacity within the city of Cleveland with this funding reaching pregnant women at high risk of experiencing a poor birth outcome.

Goals:

- Increase the number of families served prenatally.
- Increase the number of families served prenatally in their first trimester.
- Increase the number of children participating in the program that have a medical home.
- Reduce infant deaths among program participants.
- Reduce low and very low birth weight births to program participants.
- Increase father/partner involvement during pregnancy and with child 0 18 months.
- Improve breastfeeding rates among program participants.
- Improve postpartum visits among program participants.
- Increase the number of women that receive perinatal depression screening and referral.

Accomplishments:

- MomsFirst has been the recipient of Invest in Children funding for 15 years (2007-2021).
- Invest in Children funding supports the salaries of 5 Community Health Workers and 1 Case Manager.
- As a result of Invest in Children funding, one additional site provides MomsFirst services Lexington Bell Community Center.
- May Dugan also has added an additional Community Health Worker to work with adolescents.
- Invest in Children staff served approximately 215 families in 2020.

Estimated Budget: \$341,138 (each year) and other funds as they become available.
